**PROPOSED POLICY STATEMENT  
FOR MONTANA STATE PARKS**

Preamble: The Montana State Parks System and fishing access sites contain a wealth and variety of scenic, historic, archaeological, biological, scientific and recreational resources. These resources provide opportunities in variety of settings contributing to the quality cultural, recreational and economic life of the people in Montana. Montana's 41 State Parks serve a variety of purposes with some units in close proximity to urban centers as well other units at the most distant locations. It is therefore appropriate to establish broad over arching principles to guide the planning of each park unit.

**PRINCIPLES FOR PLANNING INDIVIDUAL PARKS WITHIN THE  
MONTANA STATE PARKS SYSTEM**

- Planning for each park must be based on a thorough identification, assessment and analysis of it's resources. Potential planning decisions must be measured against (a) the enabling legislation and mission statements, (b) short and long-term public need/demand for these resources, (c) capitol available, or projected to be available, (d) appropriate and sustainable use considerations.
- All planning for park units must give first priority to protecting the high quality of Montana's natural and historic resources and the sustainability of public use.
- Planning should never lose sight of the fact that Parks are for people, their use and enjoyment.
- Professional multidisciplinary planning that reflects sound principles and community values should be the foundation of Park development and protection programs.
- Community and interested publics should be involved early on and throughout the planning processes with the goal that plans will reflect community values and facilitate the development of working partnerships.
- Important planning concepts include categorizing each park based on its mission, the Recreation Opportunity Spectrum (ROS), Limits of Acceptable Change (LAC) and sustainability. Parks may also be classified as to a priority use such as recreation, cultural and historic.  
. The ROS concept has been adopted by most Federal Agencies and many States and reflects the idea that the Montana State Park system should appropriately include a wide variety of opportunities from primitive recreation for some parks

(such as we find on many of our islands) to highly developed parks (such as we find at Chief Plenty Coups and Lake Elmo).

- Planners should consider the activities of other recreation and interpretive providers such as the private campgrounds, the U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, Bureau of Reclamation, Corps of Engineers and Bureau Of Land Management to assure that future direction is compatible with other plans and a good neighbor with other existing developments and adjoining landowners.

- Planners should consider the potential “public / private partnerships “ and for the involvement of private corporations, concessionaires, foundations, volunteers, historical organizations, community organizations, environmental organizations and other interested groups in planning for implementation of park plans.

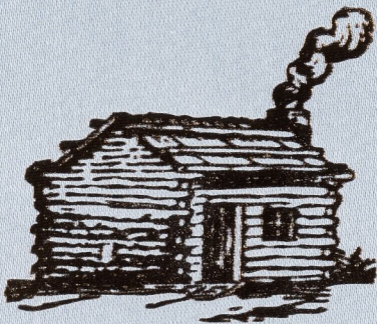

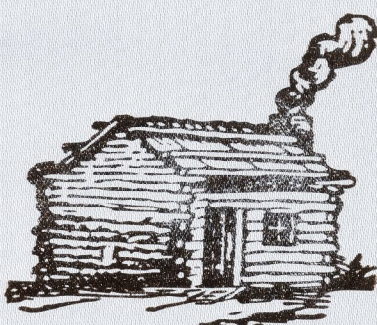
