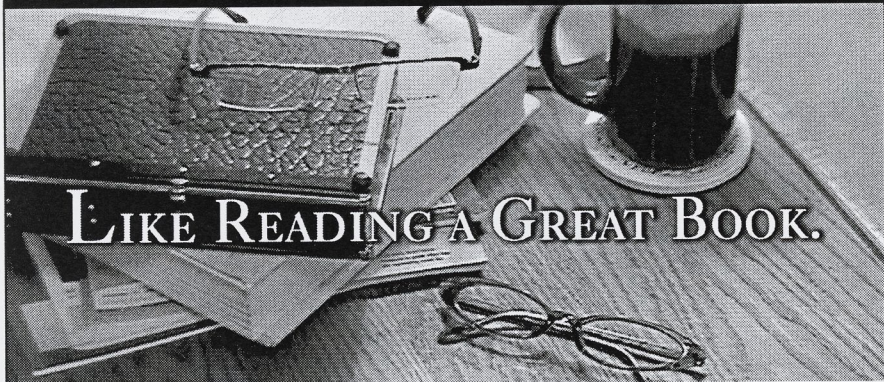
Bozeman Public Library: Past

Bozeman stands out as a city that embraces the legacy of a strong and dynamic public library. For 130 years, the library has been one of the centers of Bozeman's identity. In 1872, ten years before the city incorporated, Bozeman boasted a Young Men's Library Association that, in 1885, put up \$32.75 to start the first free library.

Since then, Bozeman has supported a library collection in space shared by the City Hall and Opera House, in the historic Carnegie Building, and at the present location on Lamme Street. At each stage, the growth and vitality of literary culture has been backed by overwhelming passage of public bonds, coupled with generous private donations.

No event better symbolizes community support than the Book Brigade ceremony which marked the move from the Carnegie Library to the current location in 1981. Hundreds of city residents turned out to pass the library's books hand-to-hand from building to building. So many people came that the line snaked across the few blocks and people had to wait their turn. For those who participated in the Book Brigade, the event remains a defining moment in community history. For those who only know the story, it symbolizes the civic spirit that attracts all of us to the Gallatin Valley.

Bozeman Public Library: Present

In the two decades since moving to the present library, the book collection has grown six-fold, to almost 100,000 volumes. The size of the population served has grown by some 40%. Presently, more than 1,200 people come to the library each day, straining facilities and services. Bozeman Public Library has the highest per capita circulation rate of any similar library in Montana. Children's programs have increased 500% in fifteen years.

Bozeman Public Library: Future

Bozeman's new library, at 50,500 square feet, will double the size of the present facility. Plans include expanded meeting facilities, reading rooms, study areas, art exhibits, a radio studio, state-of-the-art technology, children's and young adult areas, library bookstore, and additional amenities so urgently needed by patrons.

The new library site is situated on East Main Street at the gateway to historic downtown Bozeman. Located next to popular Lindley Park, home to the annual Sweet Pea Festival, the site enhances open space and links to parks and trails. There is ample space for public parking and future expansion. Set in the heart of the community, surrounded by open space, available to all, the new library will welcome and sustain its residents.

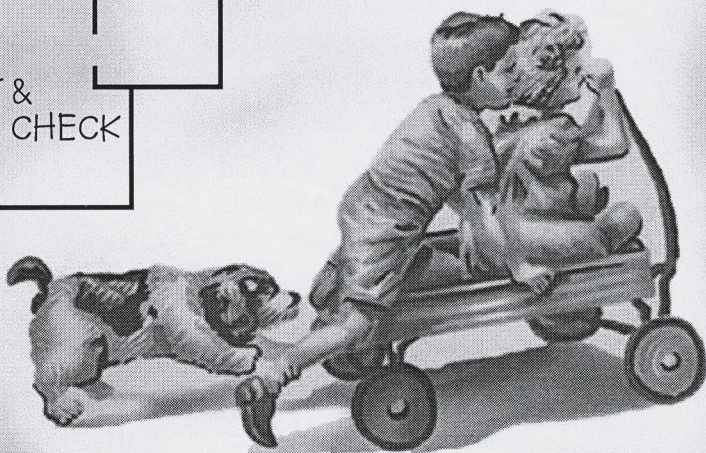
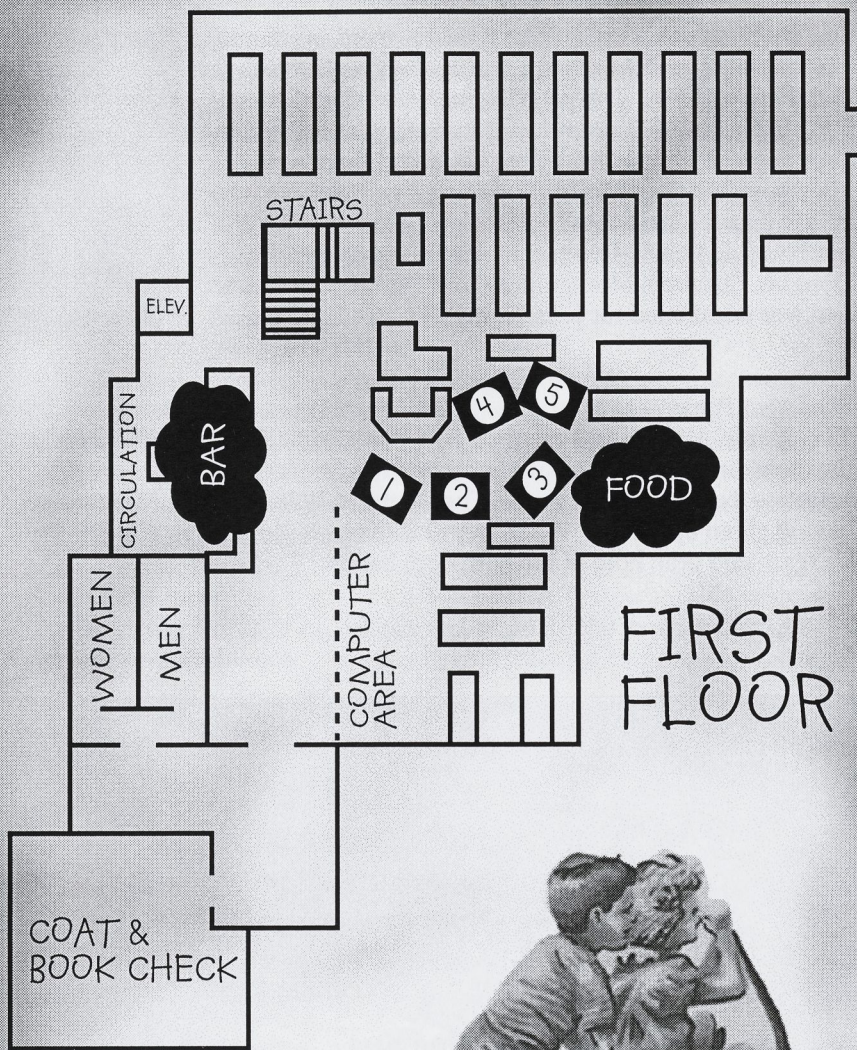

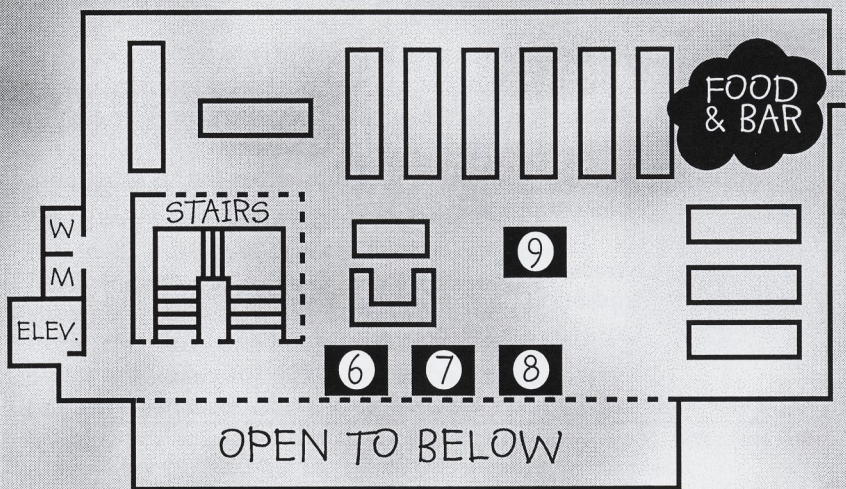

Greg Keeler

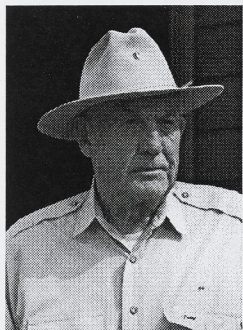

Bud Lilly has fished the streams of his native Montana for over fifty years. Besides being one of the most famous fishing guides in America, he was founding president of Montana Trout Unlimited, first chairman of the International Fly Fishing Center, a founder of the Montana Trout Foundation, a senior advisor of the Federation of Fly Fishers, and a director of the Greater Yellowstone Coalition. Bud has been profiled on CNN's "Portrait of America" series, ABC's "Twenty-Twenty," Montana's Living Legends" program, and in the Wall Street Journal.

Synopses:

Bud Lilly's Guide to Fishing the New West chronicles the environmental and social changes that are affecting trout and fly-fishing rivers in the present western waters.

A Trout's Best Friend was coauthored with Paul Schullery who lives in Yellowstone Park, is an expert fly fisherman, and the author, the coauthor, or the editor of more than a dozen books on nature and the outdoors. This book is a story of Bud's life, his family and their business, the struggle to preserve some of the most beautiful country in America, and, of course, fishing adventures.

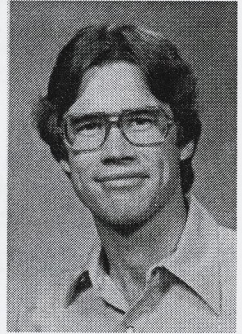
Jerry Sullivan

Born in Helena, Montana, Jerry Sullivan credited his parents and teachers for fostering his love of words and stories. Later, as Professor Emeritus at Montana State University in Bozeman, Jerry Sullivan was an addicted work nut. He published in professional journals and authored a nationally published series of textbooks optimistically intended to increase junior high school students' vocabulary. As an exchange professor from MSU, Jerry and his wife, Darlene, lived for a year in Kumamoto, Japan, where he taught English conversation classes to staff and students. Not only was he a talented writer and teacher, but a fine drummer as well. Jerry left this life on May 19, 2002 having made this world a better place.



Mark J. Sullivan, illustrator

Mark, the son of Jerry and Darlene Sullivan, grew up illustrating textbooks and stories for his father. After attaining degrees in art and music, he embarked on a teaching career that took him to the Fort Peck Indian Reservation, the Laboratory School of the University of Northern Colorado. He then completed a master's degree, and returned to Bozeman, with his wife, Suzan, and his children, Brianna and Conor. He is presently head of the Art Department at Bozeman Senior High School. Mark has illustrated sixteen books as well as numerous pamphlets and professional articles. In addition to his art career, he is a percussionist with the Bozeman Symphony Orchestra.

Jack Horner

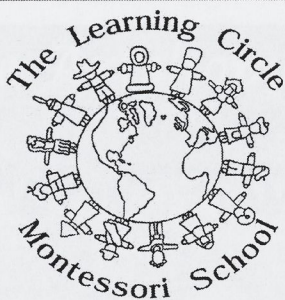

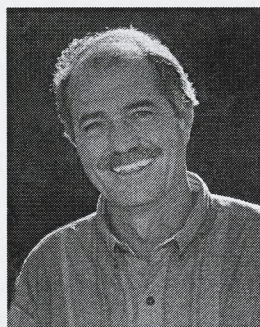

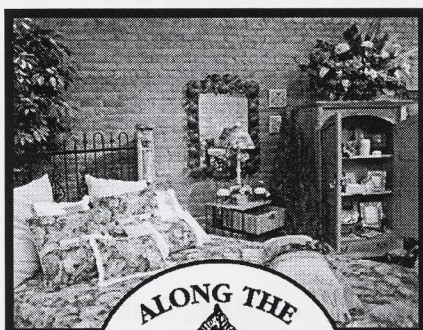
Tom Murphy

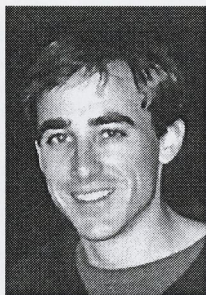

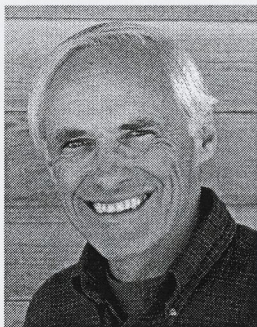
