Fly of the Month

Bead Thorax Partridge and Red – Our own Syl Nemes made great strides in resurrecting soft hackle flies from the ash heap of history. The bead thorax Partridge and red is a modernization of the centuries old soft hackle. *Give it a shot* – it is a very cool looking fly and as we know, Cutts, even more than other trout, love soft hackles and the Yellowstone should be clearing down near Gardiner about the time of our June meeting.

Hook: Nymph, 2X heavy, size 14

Rib: fine silver Mylar tinsel

Thorax: Brass bead sized to match the hook

Thread: Red 8/0

Abdomen: Red floss Hackle: Grev partridge

Note; You will need to tie off the thread after finishing the floss and tinsel wrap, push the bead to the rear so it is snug against the body, covering the thread wraps. Tie in the thread in front of the bead and do the hackle wraps between

the hook eye and the bead.

Club Activities & Events & Opportunities

In early February HwFF was informed by Bob Burnham of the **Conservation News** FFF's Western Rocky Mountain Council of a proposed ESPN fly fishing competition to occur in mid-April on public waters near Missoula and ESPN's and John Barrett's (of Barrett Productions) pursuant request for suspension of Montana fishing regulations which prohibit fishing competitions for trout on public waters. The Board of Directors of HwFF reached a quick consensus opinion in opposition to this proposal and filed our comments (below). We were gratified to learn on February 16th that the proposal had been denied by Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks. In the AP news release it was reported that some 400 written comments were received and that they ran 2 to 1 in opposition. "It's the most comments we've gotten on anything in the 13 years I've worked here." Said Chris Hunter, MT FWP Fisheries Division Administrator. Jeff Hagener, MT FWP Director, informed ESPN and John Barrett that, "To these anglers, fly fishing on Montana's rivers for wild trout does not lend itself to the competition envisioned in your proposed contest. . . fly fishing is not about competition for the biggest or most fish and that Montanans have worked hard to nurture and protect its wild trout fishery." We at HwFF celebrate this rare victory of ethics over dollars!

Dear Karen,

We request that the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks deny the application by ESPN for a fly fishing contest in the Missoula area in April. As a charter club of the Federation of Fly Fishers the Board of Directors of Headwaters Fly Fishers, Inc. – a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit – is strongly opposed to this request.

Our public river fisheries are already under stress from overuse and our club is increasingly concerned about use allocation. The ESPN proposal represents a request for a type of commercial use of a public resource that we find particularly objectionable. While we regard the services of ethical, professional outfitters and guides very positively and one which provides a benefit to the general public and the resource, we view the ESPN competition request with its attendant corporate funding and cash prizes as excessive greed and not to the benefit of the general public nor resource.

Additionally, a televised fly fishing contest from Montana is certain to: a.) increase the potential for additional such requests of similarly unacceptable commercial use of public resources; b.) set a dangerous precedent making it hard for MT FW&P to deny similar requests; and, c.) draw additional anglers to increasingly crowded Montana rivers thus adding to the existing challenges in providing science-based criteria for regulating fair opportunities for all.

More troubling is the lack of ethics of this contest, itself. For our club, contests of this sort that actually involve public resources paying cash for the catching of fish — especially trout — as opposed to innocuous fly casting, fly tying, rod building, art or charity contests — are inherently unethical, demeaning of the fish and the angler, and are not in keeping with the historic ethic of fly fishing as a contemplative sport providing a much needed respite from the day-to-day world of making a living and personal issues.

The Headwaters Fly Fishers Club, a charter club of the Federation of Fly Fishers, strongly requests that Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks deny this inappropriate request by ESPN. Thank you.

More Conservation News As reported last month, Charlie Sperry, MT Fish Wildlife & Parks Recreation Management Specialist (406-949-0105) is setting up a March 11th meeting in Bozeman starting at 7:00 p.m. at the MT FW&P offices at 1400 South 19th to report on the River Recreation Advisory Council's recommendations for managing river recreation in places of high use and conflict among user groups. This 22-member council is to complete it's work in the spring of 2003. Charlie will present an overview of the Council's charter, its issues, and public involvement into the Council's recommendations. Charlie may also discuss the Beaverhead and Big Hole biennial rules.

Classes Beginning Fly Tying A five session clinic limited to 10 attendees will start on Wednesday, March 12th at 7:00 p.m. and meet each Wednesday thereafter for a total of 5 weeks. All sessions will be held at the Fins & Feathers Fly Shop in the Bridger Peaks Town Center on North 19th. This is a great opportunity to begin tying. Rick Weisend, manager of Fins & Feathers and HwFF Board of Directors member, is leading this clinic. You can reach Rick at either the shop (586-2188) or his home (388-2706). Tell Rick it is the HwFF Club program that you want. Intermediate Fly Tying Ed Thomas will begin this class when he returns from Palm Springs in early April. The group will be limited to 5 participants so that the maximum benefit and attention can be derived by attendees. Ed is a superb tyer and specializes in flies for the Mother's Day hatch. Intro to Ladies Fly Fishing The first of four sessions was held on Saturday, January 25th as taught by Val Monroe. The basics of knots was covered on the 25th. Next session will be on March 1st and will deal with tactics. The third session focuses upon casting. And, the final session will be a real time fishing expedition either to the Madison River or a spring creek in May. This series is so popular that many graduates sign up again just to get out on the water with the group.

Intro to Fly Fishing This two-day class will be offered March 22nd to 23rd. The session on the 22nd will be held at the IFCC in Livingston from 9 to 5 p.m. The session on the 23rd will meet at the Beartrap Canyon Trailhead on the lower Madison River for a full day of instruction. Topics include: casting, reading water, gear, knots, ethics, catch and release and safety. Call Matt at the IFCC to sign up (522-9369).

Note: Class Fees Policy – the HwFF Board of Directors in effort to provide additional membership benefits will consider the following new policy at its next BOD Meeting, scheduled for February 26th:

For non HwFF members: \$40 for any class which includes a "regular" one-year membership (a \$29 value); or, if the non-HwFF member is a senior (65 or older) the class is \$33 which includes a "senior" one-year membership (a \$22 value). Anyone wanting to upgrade simply adds on the extra amount (e.g., from a regular individual to a "family" membership (a \$35 value) just add on the \$6; so the class and family membership fee would be \$46. And all HwFF members pay \$10. Refunds to those currently involved in a class will be made on a per case basis.

"Beating the Crowds"

A lot of emotions revolve around the crowding of our local rivers. There has even been some legislation limiting outfitter and non-resident access. The truth is, yes, overcrowding has become a problem, but it is only a problem if you choose to become a part of the problem. Some southern states are only blessed with a few miles of fine trout stream. Here in southwest Montana, we have thousands of miles and hundreds of lakes. It is easy to get away when you have the options we do.

The first option is obvious. Fish the smaller streams and tributaries. Tributaries and mountain streams flow through each mountain drainage. Most are fine trout streams that don't receive the attention they deserve until they meet the main river. These streams don't always have the largest trout around, but are bright, eager, healthy fish that love dry flies. During and after spawning runs, the size of fish in these streams will surprise you.

The next option is alpine lakes. If you are willing to hike away from your car and camp overnight, you will be privy to the finest fishing in the world. Our Beartooth Wilderness Area is littered with hundreds of trout lakes, many that have trophy Cutthroat, Rainbow, Brook, and even Golden Trout. You can easily find total solitude and the most breathtaking landscapes in the world. Many other mountain ranges offer fine fishing and even trophy trout potential. Buy some maps and guide books and explore! Some can even be fished with just a short day hike.

Another option is to fish the less popular sections of the rivers. The Yellowstone River's Paradise Valley is sometimes crowded in mid summer, but near Gardner and down near Springdale, you will find very few people, and the fishing is great. There are many such examples, but as a general rule, the farther you get from a major town the fewer crowds. Also, on tailwaters such as the Bighorn, Missouri, and Beaverhead, the farther you get downstream from the dam, the fewer people you will find.

The least obvious option is one of my favorites, the kick boat. Kick boats will get you away from the access points and give you miles of options. With a small pontoon boat, you can float rivers that are too low or small for drift boats. You can also feel comfortable floating down small side channels. If you find shallow water or an obstruction, you can just walk the boat downstream. Kick boats are durable, collapsible and stable. My favorite is the Water Otter, which weighs only a shade over 20lb., making it easy to walk when you need to.

With a little bit of creativity and a sense of adventure, you can find not only fewer crowds, but also total solitude. On opening day of the Beaverhead River below Clark Canyon Dam you will find many people shoulder to shoulder, but somewhere in the distance, you will find me fighting large fish with only the birds to hear my joyful cries.

"I still don't know why I fish or why other men fish, except that we like it and it makes us think and feel. But I do know that if it were not for the strong, quick life of rivers, for their sparkle in the sunshine, for the cold grayness of them under rain and the feel of them about my legs as I set my feet hard down on rocks or sand or gravel, I should fish less often. President's Message

Dear Fellow HwFF Members,

I am writing this letter with reference to an extremely serious issue which now confronts our fly fishing club. That issue is whether we should choose to withdraw from being a charter member of the Federation of Flyfishers. Your Board of Directors has given this much thought and deliberation and has voted to begin taking steps to withdraw as a member of the FFF. Let me tell you some of the reasons behind your Board's decision.

The primary reason for our decision is that the leadership of the FFF (CEO and BOD) has failed it's members across the nation in achieving any significant objectives of the organization for at least if not more than the four years during which the present leadership has been in power. There has been almost no growth in funding or significant increase in membership. In fact, approximately 70-80% of income raised from any sources (dues, gifts, or donations) is used to just pay for operating expenses. That means in simplified terms that only 20-30% of any moneys given to the FFF are available to further teaching and very minimal amount/effort at conservation issues. Do we want our donation, dues & gifts to primarily used for salaries, rent & travel expenses and not for the reported mission of the FFF.

Because of the shortfall in raising funding, the leadership has been borrowing from the life membership fund, which has decreased from about \$250,000. to about \$70,000. This fund has not been replenished even with the small increase in life members who have joined the federation over the last 4 years. There has also not been any type of major fund raising drives over the last 4 years. Any effort at increasing membership has been nothing more than a loss leader type of program, with a negative drain on FFF reserves. And speaking of reserves and our economic situation, the FFF has lost money in each of the last 4 years. For 2007, this would be disputed by our CEO, who claims a profit of about \$50000. However, the accounting used to project this so called profit lacks the transparency which we as members are entitled to. That so called profit omits to take into account approximately \$30,000 in accrued but unpaid debts, bringing the figure to \$20,000. It apparently also does not account for \$20000 in funding which the FFF was given to be used exclusively for a conservation project in Idaho. Lastly, there remains the issue of not setting aside moneys for the life members signed up for 2007 leaving us in the hole once again.

You might ask how all this came to be. It started with the determination by the FFF leadership to move the headquarters to Loveland, Colorado. I personally believe that this could be very good for the FFF, as well as the transfer of the museum assets which the FFF leadership has never promoted. But, we must remember that the FFF is a business organization. A business must be able to run profitably, no matter how noble it proclaims its mission, or it will fail. AS many of you have heard, Bob Wiltshire, the former CFO of the FFF, was recently fired by our CEO. I have been told that the salary formerly used to pay Wiltshire is now being used to fund a PR person and a fund raiser. If this is the case, why do we need to pay the current CEO somewhere in the neighborhood of \$80,000 per year plus expenses? What in the world does he do? This is one more example of mismanagement by our leadership.

The HwFF receives no dues or benefits from the FFF. In order for our club to continue to function, we, as any business, must raise funding. A Charter club of the FFF can only have members who are also members of the FFF. Our club is about teaching, some small amount of conservation, and introducing people to the sport of fly fishing. We have successfully founded the first Legends of the Headwaters program which we would hope to continue .Your BOD would much rather have your dues paid to your own hometown club than wasted on funding the operational expenses of a poorly managed parent organization .This does not mean that we cannot support activities that we feel would benefit water conservation, cleanup, and the sport of fly fishing sponsored by any other organization It does mean that we can choose where our moneys can be best spent and not wasted.

We will be taking a vote at our June, 2008 annual meeting. Our by-laws require a 2/3 approval of all club members in order to seek a withdrawal from the FFF. We then, if you can believe it, must obtain approval to withdraw from the FFF! It will be fairly simple to form a new corporation, obtain our own not- for- profit tax status, and run our own show benefiting our club and whomever we choose to support. We have already had members withdraw who do not support the FFF. If we do not get the support needed to become independent, the future of our club is in jeopardy. We will prepare proxy and mail in forms for you to sign for those of you unable to attend the June, 2008 meeting.

Your Board of Directors requests your support in continuing to make our local fly fishing club an example of excellence and pride to our community.

Thank you for taking your time to think seriously about this is issue.

Chairman Cordes and CEO Van Gytenbeek will form a group to create a proposal that focuses on the direction of the FFF and the resulting need to restructure our club relationships. This proposal will be reviewed at the board of directors meeting at the conclave.

The Meeting was adjourned at 9:20 PM.

CALL THE QUESTION

Respectfully tendered by Roger Maler

It is apparent that we, as the FFF board, are failing in our responsibility to move the corporations business forward in a prompt and diligent manner. This is not exclusive with this board as the procrastination bug seems to have affected many, or all BODs before us. We exhibit this failing whenever hard and untested decisions face us.

These are disguised by the processes of "further discussion, committee formative studies and tabling of issues" that are too difficult to bring to a conclusion. I therefore wish to make a written motion to settle three issues immediately.

- 1- Approve the move to Loveland allowing our officers to negotiate the terms to the best interest of the FFF.
- 2- Close and or move the Heritage Center. Again, allowing our officers to proceed at their discretion.
- 3- Get this organization up to and on a financial plateau to allow our BOD to act as they were elected to perform their duties.

There are three options to item # 3

A- Assess all parties as follows:

Each board member will advance their Prez club commitment in full up to \$5000. Those not willing will be asked to step down. Others not in the Prez club will also make the same contribution.

FUNDS \$120k

Each council will be expected to fund \$5 per FFF member in their council.

FUNDS \$55k

Each charter club will be expected to fund \$10 per member up to a max of \$1000 each.

FUNDS \$15k

All other clubs will be expected to fund \$2 per non FFF member.

FUNDS \$50k

All CCI and FFF guides will be expected to fund \$25 each

FUNDS \$30k

TOTAL FUNDS \$270k

The BOD has to set an example and the bar to get the ball rolling and therefore they must step up FIRST, then the councils, clubs and special interest groups. Unless ALL are part of this there is no vested interest in our organization. HOWEVER no money will be donated, not one dime, until all the factions above is (sic) willing to come to the trough.

B- Augment the above with the 100% plan as submitted below:

Confirm a formal 100% affiliated club status and possibly give it a new name like" Founder Club" since many, or most, are very old going back to the FFF beginnings themselves.

(Perhaps those chartered over 10-15 years old would only be in this select group)

Allow 2 years to bring the club to this level with 100% FFF membership.

During this 2 year period club dues would be forgiven

A special rate for all the clubs members would be \$25.

Clubs of 150 or more the rate would be \$20

For 300 or more \$15

Provide discounted club insurance to these clubs after the achieve 100%. If they are 100% within the first year an additional club rebate of \$10 per FFF member would be paid.

These rates would be for the 2 year period. Beyond that standard rated would prevail. The clubs would collect the dues and send them in.

They would provide E contacts for all members but could sell new members at the reduced rate too in the first 2 years.

PROFORMA:

Hypothetical 165 member club 15 years old with 15 life members and 30 paying FFF members

Considered at the end of the 2 year period:

165 less 15 lifers = 150x2 yrs x \$20= \$6000

Less 30 x \$35x2 =\$2100 (reduced standard rate)

Net= \$3900 gain

At 3 years the gain/set off would be an additional 120 x \$35 (full rate) or \$4200.... total \$8100 The club dues forgiven would be \$720 deducted also or a suggested gain of approximately \$3000 with the Flyfisher cost deducted.

All other promotions at cost should be deducted from the gain as well as the Flyfisher cost for 1 year

Note: as the club increases or decreases in size the gain is greater by virtue of the special rate size breaks

Nationwide if we have 250 such clubs the overall gain would be slightly under \$2 million dollars in 3 years.

Even if we paid the bonus rebate the cost of \$1650 would be offset by the dues paid by the new FFF members in year 2 at \$4200 (full rate)

C- All board members commit to a \$25,000 contribution within one year.

Please vote for or against plan 1, 2 or 3 and under (3) A, B OR C and copy all other board members. You may wish to also vote for more than one plan. Plan C is subject to some modification but the concept is what you are voting on.

Folks, this organization has been wringing its hands for too many years over this issue. Its time we get some backbone to finally turn the page and

September Meeting Great Speaker/Changed Date

Jim Goetz, Esq., the gentleman, who won our right to stream access before the Montana Supreme Court, will be the Speaker at our first meeting of the fall at the Grantree on Sept.11^{th,} 2007 starting with Dry Fly Hour at 6:30 PM and Mr. Goetz speaking at 7:30 PM.

His subject will be:

"Montana's Stream Access Law – Legal provisions, History, Dilemmas, and the Future" Judging from talking with many anglers, stream access is one of the topics at the top of their interest list. Many are wondering what the public's rights actually consist of and how the current dilemma might be resolved in the future, facts are hazy to many. James Goetz and his firm, the Goetz Law Offices in Bozeman, have been representing recreational organizations seeking, for over two decades, to maintain and clarify stream access rights as provided in Montana's State Constitution. The Goetz law firm has been involved in all the major legal actions which led to the current interpretations of stream access for Montana. Legal action is still ongoing, in part, because Montana's counties have sole jurisdiction at bridge right-of-ways and some counties are allowing landowners to place barriers to stream access at public bridges. Citizen's stream access rights are protected in an inconsistent manner across the state and State government does not have a simple, direct statute which can be used to maintain consistent compliance with the constitutional mandate. Individuals seeking to access a public waterway do not look forward to confronting access barriers or having a conflict with landowners. So, many Montanans' are wondering about their stream access rights, and what needs to be done to assure that these rights are consistently maintained across the state.

James Goetz has been a focal point in representing and clarifying the rights of the public in stream access. He will discuss the impact of the State constitution on stream access, the major legal decisions subsequent to the constitution, and the areas where dilemmas still exist in achieving stream access.

Citizens feel that in certain instances access has been arbitrarily impeded or denied. Mr. Goetz will respond to questions regarding possible legal routes aimed at preventing future denial of access. To our knowledge a presentation by a true authority on the subject has never before been made to the Gallatin County public so this is a truly special opportunity.

Fly of the Month

Bead Thorax Partridge and Red – Our own Syl Nemes made great strides in resurrecting soft hackle flies from the ash heap of history. The bead thorax Partridge and red is a modernization of the centuries old soft hackle. *Give it a shot* – it is a very cool looking fly and as we know, Cutts, even more than other trout, love soft hackles and the Yellowstone should be clearing down near Gardiner about the time of our June meeting.

Hook: Nymph, 2X heavy, size 14

Rib: fine silver Mylar tinsel

Thorax: Brass bead sized to match the hook

Thread: Red 8/0
Abdomen: Red floss
Hackle: Grey partridge

Note; You will need to tie off the thread after finishing the floss and tinsel wrap, push the bead to the rear so it is snug against the body, covering the thread wraps. Tie in the thread in front of the bead and do the hackle wraps between

the hook eye and the bead.

This is your last opportunity before the summer break to tie a winner for the 2007 Fly Plate. There was no winner last month, you missed a great opportunity, and nobody submitted a scud. Don't be shy, become the go to gal or guy!

MSU Library Trout and Salmon Series

There will be an outstanding expert in trout conservation speaking on Nov.8, 2007 at the Hager Auditorium in the Museum of the Rockies. Dr. Robert Behnke is the Inaugural Lecturer of the Trout and Salmon Lecture series of the Bud Lilly Trout Initiatives of MSU Libraries. Dr. Behnke is perhaps our nation's most eminent authority on trout biology and is Professor Emeritus at Colorado State University.

Dr. Behnke is the first invited speaker for the MSU Trout Collection "Invited Speaker Series". Dr. Behnke is acknowledged as an international expert on Trout Biology and this will be a unique opportunity to hear him speak on the subject. The area of highest interest to him, recently, has been trout subspecies which are extinct or nearly extinct. He has been responsible for finding remnant populations of at least one subspecies that was thought to have been completely extinct.

Dr. Behnke has written on such topics as native trout, improving habitats, angling tips, genetic markers in trout and native species introductions. For many years his research has focused on the biology of rare and endangered species of trout. He writes a popular column in *Trout Magazine*. His selected columns have been collected into a new book: *About Trout: The Best of Robert Behnke from Trout Magazine*.

This should be an excellent lecture to enjoy. Our thanks to the Trout Library of MSU for the opportunity to hear Dr. Behnke. The event is free to the public.
