
## Overview of the Tour

The Montana Ambassadors Fly Fishing Tour will consist of two days of guided fishing on some of southwestern Montana's premier trout fishing waters. From the gentle pool-and-riffle runs of the upper river to its narrow, downstream canyon, the Big Hole offers more variety than we will be able to cover in two days. Besides the diversity of waters, the Big Hole offers five species—Brown, rainbow, cutthroat and brook trout, plus grayling—all wild. Catch all five in one day, and you win the Big Hole Grand Slam! Depending on water temperatures, we may even catch the tail-end of the Big Hole's renowned salmonfly hatch, which triggers a frenzy on the part of both trout and angler.

Each morning you will be teamed up with an Ambassador host and your guide for the day. Breakfast and dinner will be served at the lodge; lunch will be served streamside. Liars' Hour begins at 5 p.m. when the cocktail lounge opens.

Evening events will be casual. Wednesday night, you will learn all about the waters you will be fishing the next two days during a discussion

with Dave and Chris Decker, owners of the Complete Fly Fisher; Bud Lilly, one of Montana's



most venerated fly fishing guides and Ray Tilman, veteran Bighole fisherman. Thursday night, after your first day out, will be reserved for tall tales.

We do hope you'll join us.







SUBJECT: 1991 Business Recruitment Program

Ambassador President Russ Ritter has informed me that your Board of Directors has decided to make a concentrated effort this year to attract new businesses to Montana. According to Russ, the Board has decided to bring additional resources to bear on a targeted recruitment effort.

To this end they propose to entertain out-of-state business prospects on the annual catch and release fly fishing trip, but have also decided to expand the program by inviting some prospects to the Governor's Golf Classic at Eagle Bend in August. This would allow us to entertain even more prospects and involve more Ambassadors.

In addition to entertaining prospects here in Montana, I understand there will also be a new program that will involve actually calling on targeted companies at their home offices out-of-state. These will undoubtedly be group efforts which I hope to be part of.

Obviously for any of these programs to be effective we need to have a good list of prospects. new opportunities for existing businesses to expand and grow. Another extremely beneficial program for Montana businesses, which could be imple-

mented concurrently with the business visitation program, would be an import substitution program. By identifying all the raw materials and component parts needed by Montana manufacturers, we can generate an important data base whereby Montana manufacturers can be matched with Montana suppliers for their mutual benefit and success. Both carry the potential to have some significant and measurable success in helping Montana businesses.

During 1991, I will also continue my efforts to improve Montana's overall business climate. From our burdensome tax structure to our onerous workers' compensation rate, I will continue to fight to insure that Montana businesses have an opportunity to grow and prosper in this state. We each have an important role to play in the future of this state and I appreciate your commitment to getting it done.



### Committee Notes

Business Recruitment Committee

In an effort to become more proactive, and to regain the original vision and enthusiasm of the organization, the Montana Ambassadors have embarked on a new business visitation and retention program. Growth areas on the West Coast are identified as "grid-locked," making expansion for high-growth companies difficult, and promotional materials are sent to the CEO in each company inviting consideration of Montana as a possible relocation site. When possible, an Ambassador may visit the company, making

a formal presentation. In addition, Ambassadors identify companies they know personally and invite them to consider the state in relocation or expansion plans. The business retention effort assists Montana cities and towns in reviewing resources, which can be offered to local, existing firms to keep them in the community, as well as appeal to businesses looking to relocate.

The Ambassadors and the Department of Commerce cosponsored a product exhibit in August at the Goodwill Games International Trade Exhibition in Seattle. Seventeen display booths attracted over 300 buyers worldwide. Volunteer Ambassadors also participated with Commerce in the October Calgary Business Fair, promoting 20 Montana companies.

In October, the Ambassadors, with the Department of Commerce, co-sponsored the Governor's Conference on Economic Growth and the Creation of Jobs, which took place in Helena. The conference attracted nearly 170 people from across Montana, bringing together key people with a variety of economic development interests.

Once again the committee was active in the Sixth Annual 1990 Catch and Release Fly Fishing Tour which attracted prominent business people from corporations such as GAP Clothing, American Airlines and Zion's First National Bank.

#### **Protocol Committee**

On February 2, the Protocol Committee hosted Korean and Japanese printing groups in conjunction with Falcon Press and Montana Magazine of Helena. The group met to discuss the establishment of a full-color, high-quality

print shop in Helena.

On June 20, the Protocol Committee and the Polson Chamber of Commerce co-sponsored a reception in Poslon for TAMSCO, a manufacturer of electronic subassemblies. The firm presented a procurement seminar in conjunction with Total Quality Management, an industry and defense cooperative that strives to improve the quality of products delivered to defense buyers. The seminar and reception attracted several prime contractors, including Hughes Aircraft, Texas Instruments, Lockheed, ITT, Beech, Boeing and the U.S. Department of Defense.

Several Japanese bankers were hosted by the committee June 20 at the Montana Club in Helena in order to interest them in Montana

real estate investments.

The Protocol Committee, the Department of Commerce and Governor Stan Stephens cosponsored the Governor's Summit Conference on Economic Development and the Creation of Jobs in Helena, October 11 and 12. Nearly

170 people interested in economic development attended the conference from all parts of Montana. A major portion of funding for the event came from sponsorship by Montana corporations interested in development of the state.


