8. Executive Summary:

Montana State University Libraries' Trout & Salmonid Collection already has 2,000 titles on the shelf, with thousands more still unboxed from a major gift to the collection. The entire collection is or will be bibliographically accessible internationally via the Internet. We believe that the collection, in just three years, has reached a position of national prominence. Specifically, the funds requested from the Montana Trout Foundation would be directed toward strengthening the collection in the areas of trout & trout stream management and trout diseases via the purchase of science-oriented monographs. Matching funds will be directed toward building the collection in the complementary areas of angling, politics and public policy, literature, culinary aspects, etc.

Our goal is to build *the* nationally prominent Trout and Salmonid collection. The MSU Libraries' Trout & Salmonid Collection is the centerpiece of a larger vision that will eventually be encompassed in The Bud Lilly Chair in Trout & Salmonid Bibliography, which will include a collection endowment, an endowed lecture series, and an endowed member of the library faculty devoted to trout informatics. The collection will enable Montana State University ("Trout U") to preserve and advance its distinctive combination of teaching, research, creativity, and service as it relates to the trout and its habitat.

Grant Proposal:

The funds requested from the Montana Trout Foundation would be directed toward strengthening the collection in the areas of trout & trout stream management and trout diseases via the purchase of science-oriented monographs. It is anticipated that many of these will be doctoral dissertations, representing highly focused and unique research; such materials seldom find their way to libraries other than that of the home institution. Adding such titles to our collection will make it noteworthy and more useful to MSU fish and fisheries researchers and students. It is projected that the amount requested will permit us to add 80-100 select titles.

In addition, matching funds the library will continue to purchase materials for the collection in the complementary areas of angling, politics and public policy, literature, culinary aspects, etc.

Our goal is to build *the* nationally prominent Trout and Salmonid collection. The MSU Libraries' Trout & Salmonid Collection is the centerpiece of a larger vision that will eventually be encompassed in The Bud Lilly Chair in Trout & Salmonid Bibliography, which will include a collection endowment, an endowed lecture series, and an endowed member of the library faculty devoted to trout informatics. The collection will enable Montana State University ("Trout U") to preserve and advance its distinctive combination of teaching, research, creativity, and service as it relates to the trout and its habitat by:

- Developing the world's preeminent research collection of titles devoted to the trout and other salmonids.
- Enhancing the support of critical MSU undergraduate and graduate programs in fish and fisheries management and trout related-field research.
- Strengthening "trout awareness" by providing resources that will be the foundation for traditional and non-traditional educational outreach activities.
- Investing in the building of knowledge infrastructure to support research and education to preserve and improve trout environments.
- To secure into the 21st century and beyond those distinctive features of intellectual seriousness, artistic vibrancy, and social engagement that have defined Montana State University as the state's land grant university since it's founding in 1893.

Methodology:

The library will consult with experts such as Drs. Ray White, Calvin Kaya, and Al Zale regarding key topics/terms/works in trout & trout stream management and trout disease. Various databases will be searched to determine appropriate titles. Subsequently, titles will be ordered from wherever necessary.

Evaluation:

This project is not research per se. Rather it is a process of building research information infrastructure. Therefore, project evaluation lies in the assessment of whether there has been success in adding information content/titles in targeted critical areas. This kind of assessment is done continually as the collection grows.

Montana Trout Foundation Minutes of the September 15, 2002 Meeting MSU Library

Board members in attendance:

Bud Lilly - President Richard Vincent - Executive Director Ross Bruner - Treasurer. Harry Miller Tim Crawford Gordon Haugen

- Meeting was opened by President Bud Lilly. The agenda prepared by Vincent was reviewed. Bud Noted that at the end of the meeting there will be tour of the MSU Trout Library and refreshments would be served.
- Secretary's Report Minutes of the Spring 2002 meeting prepared by Vincent were approved. as written.
- Treasurer's Report Bruner gave a lengthy and detailed Treasurers Report with numerous handouts detailing Montana Trout Foundation's (MTF) current financial status as well as a historical perspective of fund raising. Each of the board members in attendance were given the handouts for their review and record. The following are high lights of the treasurer report presented by Bruner.
- 95% of the funds generated by the MTF were secured prior to 1993.
- The MTF has not had a active fund raising effort since 1993.
- Investments have been a major source of income since 1993, however, with the current down turn in the market, the situation for disbursing funds in 2003 are going to be reduced. Bruner projected that with our current balance of just over \$300,000.00 at 6% this would be in the neighborhood of \$18,000.00.
- -Investments were discussed. Bruner recommended that the MTF investment be adjusted to reflect the current market performance. He recommended that the MTF investments be moved into more bonds than stocks and that

the MTF retain the services of a broker to manage our funds. It was moved by Harry Miller and seconded by Tim Crawford that the MTF except the recommendations made by Bruner. Lilly called for vote --- **Passed**

- **-501 C Tax Status** Bruner report that the MTF has lost its 501 C tax status and is now a private foundation and will have to pay a 2% federal income tax.. To retain the 501 C status we will have to demonstrate for a 2-3 year period that 1/3 of our annual income is from donations.
- Dispersments Burner handout a ledger of listing MTF dispersments. Lengthy discussion followed.. MTF needs take credit for what it has funded over years and needs to use this track record for the bases of generation new dollars. If we are unable to bring the MTF up to the expectations of the Charter the MTF existence is in jeopardy. It was moved Bruner and seconded by Miller that if the MTF is unable to demonstrate within four years and not retain the 501 -C Tax Status that the MTF be dissolved as allowed for in the bylaws. Bud Lilly called for a voted . Passed

A site Access 2, Fly Fishing only. Harry recommended that the MTF return the \$50,000.00 as received from the Montana Dept. of Fish, Wildlife and Parks and seek legal consul. Miller and Lilly will contact Kent Kasting to see what needs to be done to return the \$50,000.00 to the Olson Estate. Miller hoped to have this completed by the Oct. 15, 2002.
