Dear Red;

Since closing Nov. 1, I've been doing some work on my 1970 catalog. I want to again solicit members for our West Yellowstone Trouters in this years catalog as I aid last year. Before I do though would it be possible to do two things?

First, write a report on fishing in our area this past year and a brief forecast for the coming season and second, write a letter to the Montana Fish and Game Dept. requesting that the rainbow trout formerly being planted in the Madison river between Earthquake Lake and Meadow Lake be stopped. That these trout be planted in Hebgen Lake and the Gallatin river.

The district fisheries biologist here in Bozeman report that the results of their electro-shocking fishing studies on the Madison river in the Varney Bridge section and two other 2 mile sections of the river upstream from here, show increased numbers of trout over the same studied areas the year before.

They conclude that these increases are due to more stable water flows maintained in early spring and Ball by Montana Power Co. They do note however that some age groups of trout do not carry over as they should and suspect that the introduction of 8-12" hatchery rainbows into the Madison may cause a decrease in wild trout numbers. It is the feeling of the Montana F & G biologists that no stocking would greatly benefit the river in a year or two. These people have extensive data over a 4 year period to substaniate their conclusions.

In any event with continued release of less violent flows limits at Hebgen Dam, the Montana Fish and Game Dept. expects the Madison to show marked fishing improvement. This would be of interest to West Yellowstone Trouters. Also the introduction of the rainbow in to Hebgen Lake would help improve angler success here. Studies show lake stocking many times more successful than streams.

Also of interest to West Yellowstone Trouters will be proposed fishing regulation changes in Yellowstone Park again this year. The new regulations have not been adopted, but it has been suggested that trout under 16" be released. No grayling may be kept and only 3 cutthroat over 14" may be kept.

I would like to see some of this information included in an extensive report to our club members. These club members

could be solicited to write letters supporting this request of Montana Fish & Game to ask Federal Hatchery at Ennis to cease and desist in the stocking of rainbow in the Madison river above Meadow (Ennis) Lake. In studying a section of the Madison river below Meadow Lake where flows are almost constant and no rainbow stocking is done, they have found wild trout population double to those upstream from Meadow Lake, The stream is essentially the same type in both areas. If any of this B.S. sounds worth while, I would hope that a letter could be written to the F.& G. making this request and soliciting all the support for it we can from anyone. I would also very much favor a report of some kind to members. Many who paid their dough would like to hear from us. During January, I'll be in Calif. talking to fishing clubs. I intend to mention this to these groups and to ask for their support if you agree to the move. From my information this would be a good time to make this request of the F. & G. They have stated through the papers their intentions to simplify fishing and hunting regulations. It would seem logical to stop planting and reduce the limit. Five trout is a good number. Hope you and Marge are well and enjoying yourself. I'll be back in Bozeman the last of January. Sincerely: Bud Lilly
