If you notify this office in writing within 30 days from receiving this notice, that the debt, or any portion thereof is disputed, this office will obtain verification of the debt or obtain a copy of a judgment and mail you a copy of such judgment or verification. If you request this office in writing within 30 days after receiving this notice, this office will provide you with the name and address of the original creditor, if different from current creditor.

When you send in a check to make your payment, you authorize Client Services, Inc. to initiate a one-time electronic debit from your bank account according to the terms of the check. When your check is converted to an electronic debit, please note that your check will not be returned to your bank and funds may be withdrawn from your checking account the same day we receive your payment. You have the responsibility to:

Provide accurate and complete information regarding present complaints,
past illnesses, hospitalizations, medication and
other matters relating to your medical needs.

Cooperate with the treatment plan recommended by your physician, including instruction by nurses and allied health personnel as they facilitate the plan of care.

Report any unexpected changes in your condition or any difficulties or concerns you have as soon as possible.

Understand your illness and treatment; if not, request that additional explanation be provided.

Accept full responsibility when refusing treatment or not following the physician's instruction.

Make any concerns, complaints or grievances known to your care provider in order that they may be resolved in a timely manner by either the immediate health care provider or by hospital administration.

Show respect for other patients by following hospital rules to assist in the control of noise, smoking and visitation.

Follow Hospital rules and regulations affecting patient care and conduct.

Be considerate of the property of other persons and the hospital.

Treat your physician and hospital staff in the same *courteous manner* that you expect your health care team to treat you.

Notify appropriate personnel if a **language** barrier exists or any assistive devices are required so that these services can be secured.

Provide the hospital with a copy of your advanced directives.

Ensure that financial obligations for health care are fulfilled as promptly as possible.

If you have *concerns regarding your care* please speak to your nurse or physician or ask for a patient feedback form. You may also ask to speak to the department manager or designee. Should you find that any concern or complaint goes unresolved you may contact the Bozeman Deaconess Hospital Quality Manager and/or the State Department with your complaint and/ or a grievance. You will be provided with the steps of the investigation, results and date of completion.

Patient's Rights &
Responsibilities



As a patient at Bozeman Deaconess Hospital you have important rights that ensure you receive the highest quality of healthcare. All of your rights also apply to any person that has legal responsibility to make decisions regarding your medical care. Every employee is committed to caring for you according to these standards.



You have the right to:

Considerate and respectful care and to be made comfortable. Have your cultural, psychosocial, spiritual and **personal values**, **preferences and beliefs** respected.

Have a family member (or other representative of your choosing) and your own physician **notified of your admission** to the hospital in a timely manner.

Know the names of the physicians, nurses and other healthcare professionals who are involved with your care and the role they play in your care.

Receive information regarding your health status, diagnosis, prognosis and course of treatment in terms that you can understand. **You have the right to participate** in the development and implementation of your plan of care. You have the right to participate in **ethical questions** that arise in the course of your care, including issues of conflict resolution, withholding resuscitative services, and forgoing or withdrawing life-sustaining treatment.

Make decisions regarding medical care, and receive as much information about any proposed treatment or procedure as you may need in order to give informed consent. Except in an emergency this information shall include a description of the procedure or treatment, the medically significant risks involved, alternative options for treatment and non-treatment and the risks and benefits of all options and the name of the provider that will carry out the procedure or treatment.

Request or refuse treatment, to the extent permitted by law. However you do not have the right to demand inappropriate or medically unnecessary treatment or services. You have the *right to leave the hospital even against medical advice* to the extent permitted by law. You have the right to be informed of the medical consequences of any of these actions.

Be advised if the hospital/physician proposes to engage in or perform human experimentation/ **research** affecting your care or treatment. You have the right to refuse or participate in such research projects.

Reasonable responses to any reasonable requests made for service.

Appropriate assessment and *management of pain*.

Formulate an *advance directive*. This includes designating a person to make decisions for you in the event you become incapable of understanding a proposed treatment or are unable to communicate your wishes regarding care. Hospital staff and practitioners shall comply with these directives. All patient rights apply to the person who has legal responsibility to make decisions regarding your medical care on your behalf.

Respect for personal privacy. Case discussion, consultation, examination and treatment are confidential and shall be conducted discreetly. You have the right to be told the name and reason for the presence of any individual involved in your care. You have the right to have visitors leave prior to an examination and/or when treatment issues are being discussed. Privacy barriers will be used in all semi-private areas.

Confidential treatment of all

communications and records pertaining to your care and stay in the hospital. Basic information that is included in our facility directory, such as your location within the hospital and your general condition may be released unless specifically prohibited in writing by you. Written permission shall be obtained before *medical records* are made available to anyone not directly concerned with your care, except as otherwise required or permitted by law.

Access information contained in our records within a reasonable time frame, except when not permitted by law.

Receive care in a *safe environment*, free from sexual, emotional, verbal or physical abuse or harassment.

Be **free from restraints** of any form used as a means of coercion, discipline, convenience, or retaliation by staff.

Continuity of care and to be provided with information regarding the plan of care and any continued health care requirements following your discharge and the identity of the persons providing this care.

Know any **hospital rules** or policies that apply to your conduct while a patient.

Designate *visitors of your choosing* in accordance with the hospital visitation policy.

Examine and *receive explanation* of your hospital bill regardless of source of payment. You have the right to be *informed of any business relationships* between the hospital and any health care providers, institutions or businesses that may influence your treatment and care.

Exercise these rights without regard to sex, economic status, educational background, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sexual orientation or marital status, or *the source of payment for care*.

Be satisfied with the medical care you receive. You have the right to *file a grievance and/or file a complaint* with the State Department of Health Services and/or the hospital and be informed of the action taken. (See back page)

To be an *active participant* in your own medical care as long as your actions do not infringe upon the rights of other patients or upon the rights and responsibilities of the hospital.

- your employer to determine workplace-related illness or injury; in most cases you will receive notice that information is disclosed to your employer.
- We may release your personal health information if required by law to a government oversight agency conducting audits, investigations or civil or criminal proceedings.
- We may release your personal health information if required to do so by subpoena or discovery request; in some cases you will have notice of such release.
- We may release your personal health information to law enforcement officials as required by law to report wounds and injuries and crimes.
- We may release your personal health information to coroners and/or funeral directors consistent with law.
- We may release your personal health information if necessary to arrange an organ or tissue donation from you or a transplant for you.
- We may release your personal health information if, in limited instances, we suspect a serious threat to health or safety.
- We may release your personal health information if you are a member of the military as required by armed forces services; we may also release your personal health information if necessary for national security or intelligence activities.
- We may release your personal health information to workers' compensation agencies if necessary for your workers' compensation benefit determination.



Your health information rights

Although your health record is the physical property of BDHS, the information belongs to you. You have the right:

- To copy and/or inspect much of the personal health information that we retain on your behalf. All requests for access must be made in writing and signed by you or your representative. You may obtain an access request form from BDHS Medical Records, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, MT 59715.
- To request in writing that personal health information that we maintain about you be amended or corrected. We are not obligated to make all requested amendments but will give each request careful consideration. All amendment requests, in order to be considered by us, must be in writing, signed by you or your representative, and must state the reasons for the amendment/correction request. If an amendment or correction you request is made by us, we may also notify others who work with us and have copies of the uncorrected record if we believe that such notification is necessary. You may obtain an amendment request form from BDHS Medical Records, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, MT 59715.
- To receive an accounting of certain disclosures made by us of your personal health information after April 14, 2003. Requests must be made in writing and signed by you or your representative. Accounting request forms are available from BDHS Medical Records, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, MT 59715. The first accounting in any 12-month period is free; you will be charged a fee for each subsequent accounting you request within the same 12-month period.
- To request a restriction on certain uses and disclosures of your information as provided by 45 CFR 164.522. BDHS will honor your request for restrictions to the extent possible.

- To request restrictions on certain of our uses and disclosures of your personal health information for treatment, payment or health care operations. A restriction request form can be obtained from BDHS Medical Records, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, MT 59715. We are not required to agree to your restriction request but will attempt to accommodate reasonable requests when appropriate and we retain the right to terminate an agreed-to restriction if we believe such termination is appropriate. In the event of a termination by us, we will notify you of such termination. You also have the right to terminate, in writing or orally, any agreed-to restriction.
- To obtain additional copies of the Notice of Privacy Practices upon request.

You will be asked to sign an acknowledgment form that you received this Notice of Privacy Practices.

For more information or to report a problem

If you believe your privacy rights have been violated, you can file a complaint with the BDHS Privacy Officer or with the Secretary of Health and Human Services. Notice of Privacy Practices



THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW
MEDICAL INFORMATION ABOUT

REVIEW IT CAREFULLY.

The terms of this Notice of Privacy Practices apply to Bozeman Deaconess Health Services (BDHS) operating as a clinically integrated health care arrangement composed of Bozeman Deaconess Hospital and Bozeman Deaconess Health Group and the physicians and other licensed professionals seeing and treating patients at each of these facilities. All of the entities and persons listed will share personal health information of our patients as necessary to carry out treatment, payment, and health care operations as permitted by law.



We are required by law to maintain the privacy of our patients' personal health information and to provide patients with notice of our legal duties and privacy practices with respect to your personal health information. We are required to abide by the terms of this Notice so long as it remains in effect. We reserve the right to change the terms of this Notice of Privacy Practices as necessary and to make the new Notice effective for all personal health information maintained by us. You may receive a copy of any revised notices at BDHS Patient Registration or a copy may be obtained by mailing a request to BDHS Patient Financial Services, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, MT 59715-6999.

Examples of disclosure for treatment, payment and health operations

BDHS will use your personal health information for your treatment.

For instance, doctors and nurses and other professionals involved in your care will use information in your medical record and information that you provide about your symptoms and reactions to plan a course of treatment for you that may include procedures, medications, tests, etc. We may also release your personal health information to another health care facility or professional who is not affiliated with our organization but who is or will be providing treatment to you.

We will use your health information for payment.

For instance, we may forward information regarding your medical procedures and treatment to your insurance company to arrange payment for the services provided to you or we may use your information to prepare a



bill to send to you or to the person responsible for your payment.

We will use and disclose your personal health information for our health care operations.

For instance, clinical improvement, professional peer review, business management, accreditation and licensing, etc.

Permitted uses and disclosures

Your Authorization: Except as outlined below, we will not use or disclose your personal health information for any purpose unless you have signed a form authorizing the use or disclosure. You have the right to revoke that authorization in writing unless we have taken any action in reliance on the authorization.

Facility Directory: We maintain a facility directory listing the name, room number, general condition and, if you wish, your religious affiliation. Unless you choose to have your information excluded from this directory, the information, excluding your religious affiliation, will be disclosed to anyone who requests it by asking for you by name. This information, including your religious affiliation, may also be provided to members of the community clergy. You have the right during registration to have your information excluded from this directory.

Family and Friends Involved In Your Care: With your approval, we may from time to time disclose your personal health information to designated family, friends, and others who are involved in your care or in payment of your care in order to facilitate that person's involvement in caring for you or paying for your care. If you are unavailable, incapacitated, or facing an emergency medical situation, and we determine that a limited disclosure may be in your best interest, we may share limited

personal health information with such individuals without your approval. We may also disclose limited personal health information to a public or private entity that is authorized to assist in disaster relief efforts in order for that entity to locate a family member or other persons that may be involved in some aspect of caring for you.

Business Associates: Certain aspects and components of our services are performed through contracts with outside persons or organizations, such as auditing, accreditation, legal services, etc. At times it may be necessary for us to provide certain aspects of your personal health information to one or more of these outside persons or organizations who assist us with our health care operations. In all cases, we require these business associates to appropriately safeguard the privacy of your information.

Development Activities: We may release demographic information about you to Bozeman Deaconess Foundation. Allowable information that may be released to the Bozeman Deaconess Foundation includes: name, address, phone number, age, gender, insurance status, and dates of service. Information regarding illnesses and/or treatments will not be released. If you do not want to receive direct solicitations regarding current fundraising efforts please send written notification to: Bozeman Deaconess Hospital, 915 Highland Blvd., Bozeman, Montana, 59715, c/o Marketing Communications Department.

Appointments and Services: We may contact you to provide appointment reminders, test results or information about treatment alternatives or other health-related benefits and services that may be of interest to you.

Health Products and Services: We may from time to time use your personal health information to communicate with you about health products and services necessary for your treatment, to advise you of new products and services we offer, and to provide general health and wellness information.

Research: In limited circumstances, we may use and disclose your personal health information for research purposes. For example, a research organization may wish to compare outcomes of all patients that received a particular drug and will need to review a series of medical records. In all cases where your specific authorization has not been obtained, your privacy will be protected by strict confidentiality requirements applied by an Institutional Review Board or privacy board which oversees the research or by representations of the researchers that limit their use and disclosure of

Required uses and disclosures

We are permitted or required by law to make certain other uses and disclosures of your personal health information without your consent or authorization, including but not limited to the following:

- We may release your personal health information for any purpose required by law.
- We may release your personal health information for public health activities, such as required reporting of disease, injury, and birth and death, and for required public health investigations.
- We may release your personal health information as required by law if we suspect child abuse or neglect; we may also release your personal health information as required by law if we believe you to be a victim of abuse, neglect or domestic violence.
- We may release your personal health information to the Food and Drug Administration if necessary to report adverse events, product defects or to participate in product recalls.
- We may release your personal health information to your employer when we have provided health care to you at the request of

Professional fees charged by these physicians for services provided to you will be billed by the physician separately and apart from the fees charged by the hospital. If you receive a bill from the physician and have questions, please call the telephone number listed on that statement.





A Guide to Your Hospital Bill

Bozeman Deaconess Hospital is pleased to provide this information to help you understand our patient billing practices.

e are committed to fulfilling our mission to improve community health and quality of life. To ensure the success of this commitment

we must be financially responsible. We take a positive and proactive approach to patient billing and collections with the goal of receiving payment



for services rendered in the most efficient, timely and customer oriented manner possible. We also understand that billing and collections for health care services can be confusing. To assist you in understanding these billing services and to answer any questions you may have in advance, please review the following material.

The Patient Hospital Bill

As a routine practice, the hospital attempts to collect all known patient expenses prior to the delivery of services, when appropriate, or while the patient is in the hospital. This includes deductibles, co-pays and co-insurance amounts. Because treatment plans may change during your stay it is difficult to know our final total charges at the time of admission or discharge from the hospital. It is possible that charges may be added to your account after discharge.

Processing Your Bill

If you have current insurance coverage, the hospital will bill your insurance carrier shortly after health care services have been rendered. You will receive a monthly statement illustrating how much we expect you and your insurance to pay. Each visit to the hospital will create a new visit number that will be listed separately on your statement. This enables us to track payments more accurately. After several attempts to get your insurance company to pay without success, the hospital may ask for your assistance in getting the bill paid. Once payment

from your primary insurance is received, the hospital will also submit a bill to your secondary insurer if applicable.

If you do not have insurance, a bill will be sent shortly after services are rendered, or after you are discharged from the hospital, requesting payment of the balance due. If you are unable to pay the entire amount, or wish to make payment arrangements, please contact our Customer Service Department at the phone number on your bill.

Financial Assistance Program

Bozeman Deaconess Hospital offers a program to help uninsured patients find services and benefits available to them to assist them pay their medical bills. The program, Medical Advocacy Services in Healthcare (MASH), employs a Patient Care Advocate based at Bozeman Deaconess Hospital who assists uninsured patients whose medical bills exceed a certain amount. The MASH advocate may contact you if your hospital visit/admission qualifies for as-

sistance. Our goal is to match patients with funding sources they may qualify for such as Medicaid, Social Security and various other programs.

Patients with balances due resulting from limited or no insurance coverage may qualify for our charity care or financial assistance program. This program is designed to assist patients who are financially unable to pay their bill. Each application is reviewed on an individual basis with eligibil-

ity based on family size, income, assets and outstanding debt. The patient is responsible for providing information requested during the qualification process and will continue to receive a bill until eligibility has been determined. Please ask a Financial Counselor or our Credit Supervisor for more information about this program.







SAN JOSE

San Jose, the capital of Costa Rica, is the premier city of the country, a sophisticated and vital center. It has a vibrant night life, flourishing market, museums and galleries, and many international restaurants and hotels. Radiating out of San Jose are less busy central valley towns and suburbs, each with its own flavor and identity. The palm-lined beaches from Puerto Viejo to Manzanillo on Costa Rica's southern Caribbean coast are sparcely populated, providing a feeling of isolation and adventure.
