1. TU Fishing Survival Kit

Fishing enthusiasts are by nature fairly honest people, right? There are times, though, when fabrication becomes more of an art form and quite possibly a survival tool in itself. To kick off the 35th annual benefit auction, we thought a Fishing Survival Kit was an appropriate item and was gathered through discussions with the most honest Trout Unlimited members. We can just about guarantee that these items will at some time serve a purpose, whether you're late for dinner or helping a close friend out of the water. By the way, to our knowledge no other kit of this kind exists in the world and that's no fish story.

2. Nelson's Spring Creek by Phil Scholer

Artist Phil Scholer dramatically captures the splendor of this world famous fishing site in the light of a late Montana afternoon. This print visually communicates the spirit of fly fishing through the pleasure of scenic tranquillity, combined with the vigorous skill, strength and determination needed to fish the creek. It's the feeling that excites every fisherman who has waded these chilled spring waters searching for monster trout. The print number is 394 out of 850.

These "Fly Fish" mirrors by Missoula artist Karen Peterson are hand-cut and etched so that each is unique. They'll look great hanging on your den or living room wall. Karen's glass etchings of nature scenes on doors, windows, mirrors, and shower doors have been enhancing homes and businesses with their startling detail and fine craftsmanship throughout Montana and beyond for over ten years. The "Fly Fish" are constructed from 10 individual pieces of glass. Karen's ability to recreate the fine detail of wildlife on glass comes from years of working with real animals and fish in a taxidermy shop.

4. Northern Pike Fishing Trip - Canada

If you have been looking for a destination spot that has solitude, unbelievable fishing and great service, Gypsy Lake, located 25 minutes by air from the city of Ft. McMurray in Northeast Alberta, is for you. The main lodge, two large duplex style cabins, a shower house and various other utility buildings are the only facilities on this 14 square mile lake which is accessible in the summer by floatplane only. In June, a 26-1/2 lb. northern pike was caught on a fly rod, with more than 40 pike over 20 lbs. boated during the week-long trip. This five day trip includes boats and fuel, lodging, home cooked meals and spectacular fishing. Please note that guides are not needed due to the quality of fishing available on the lake. The roundtrip floatplane ride from Ft. McMurray is included in the package. Other transportation, licenses, tackle and beverages will be the responsibility of the successful bidder. This trip is for one person and good for 1995 only, with additional spots available for a cost of \$935.

5. Swiss Army Watches

Its sturdy solid stainless steel body with snap construction has been individually tested to be water resistant to 330 feet and is appropriate for all dress codes. This his and her package has the precision accuracy you'd expect from a timepiece that bears the name Swiss Army.

6. Montana Trout Club Fishing Adventure

Set in a valley surrounded by the spectacular Ruby, Tobacco Root and Pioneer Mountains, the Montana Trout Club, managed by the Winston Rod Company, is located in southwestern Montana on the Diamond "O" Ranch. The ranch covers 6000 acres of rich grassland and rolling hills crossed by nearly 11 miles of the Beaverhead River and Albers Spring Creek. In support of TU, Winston has donated a fly fishing package for two guests which includes lodging, chef-prepared meals and a special fly fishing experience. The trip includes a two day basic fly fishing school and two days of guided fishing on a 6-mile stretch of the Beaverhead, known as one of the state's foremost "big fish" waters, and private fishing on Albers Spring Creek. The ranch combines the tradition and elegance of a private fishing club with a rustic ranch setting. Transportation to Montana and licenses are the responsibility of the bidder. 




