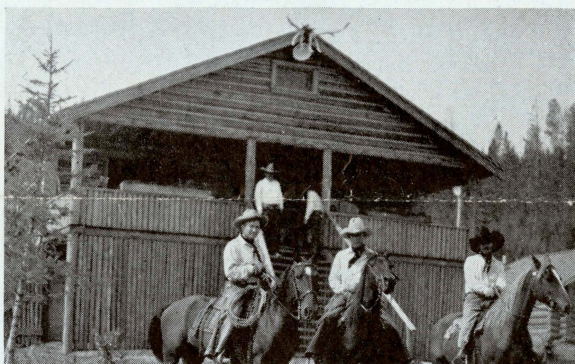




*An Ocean of Mountains is Embraced in the Anaconda-Pintler Primitive Area where the Ranch is Located*

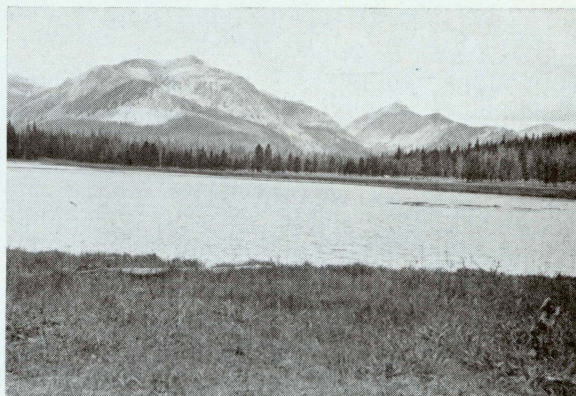
## Haggin Y/P Ranch

An old-time cattle and horse ranch, in the Montana country of mountain men and vigilantes, opens its doors the year around to a capacity of thirty guests. The ranch is under the management and direction of Dr. W. L. Beal. It is halfway between Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks and guests often combine a ranch vacation and a park tour from here.

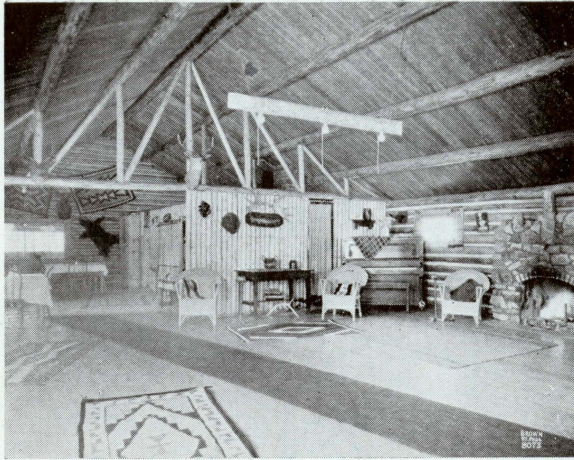
It is located fifty miles from Drummond, Montana, at the base of the Rocky Mountains in the low rolling foothills and behind it are 28 of the highest peaks of the Rockies, labyrinths of mountain canyons, numerous rushing streams and 52 crystalline mountain lakes. Fish in all of them! Its elevation is 6,300 feet, ideal for winter and summer activities. The Federal government has set this area aside as the Anaconda-Pintler Primitive Area because of its natural grandeur and as a typical section to be kept as it is for future generations. A great portion of this 175,000 acres has never been surveyed.

The Haggin Ranch region is a cattle country with the traditions and reminders of Indian inhabitants, vigilantes, road agents, old-time prospectors, cattle rustlers and "ghost" cities, making opportunities for many varieties of entertainment possible. Its first white visitors—the famous explorers, Lewis and Clark—cast eyes upon it more than a century and a quarter ago. Nearby the golden spike of the Northern Pacific was driven, signifying the union of the East with the Pacific Coast by the first northern transcontinental railroad. The first gold found in Montana was also in this locality. There are hot springs, caves and stamp mills among the many places of special interest. From the highest peaks, both Yellowstone and Glacier Parks can be seen if the atmosphere is clear, as it usually is. Days are bright and beautiful and nights are cool. Fall weather is perfect in the Indian summer of September, October and November. Winter weather is usually moderate, with snow conditions and terrain conducive to winter sports for beginners or experts. Lessons can be had from outstanding instructors.

All buildings are of logs. The old ranch house is 70 ft. x 30 ft., containing an old-fashioned ranch living room, fireplace, bath and five sleeping rooms. There are six guest cottages of three rooms housing two to four guests each. An office building also has quarters, consisting of two rooms, for guests. Electric

Fresh vegetables come to the table daily from the nearby Bitter Root Valley and because the ranch is in the center of a country leading in the production of cattle, sheep, hogs and poultry, excellent fresh meats always have a prominent place on the menu.

Incidentals such as drugs, tobacco, candy, cold drinks, ice cream, stamps, films, leather goods, western hats, hat-bands, hair bridles, navajo blankets, handkerchiefs, hunting and fishing licenses, fishing tackle, etc., are available at the ranch store.

Saddle trips of two miles and farther are one of the principal activities. Archery, boating on Georgetown Lake, picnics, hiking, picture-taking, swimming, fishing, rodeos, pack trips and dancing are the round of other amusements. Georgetown Lake is a paradise for fishing and the largest trout and grayling spawning station in the world is located there. The Montana game farm is not far off. Winter sports include ice-boating, skijoring, skiing, skating, sleigh-riding, and tobogganing. Ski tows subdue the big hills.

Pack trips into Pintler Primitive Area of 4 to 10 or 14 days—a specialty. \$12.50 to \$15.00 per day, per person. These trips are possible the last week of July on until September 15th. Arrangements should be made as early as May 15th. Groups of 4 to 10 persons in each party. Mixed parties are possible, but most parties are exclusively male or female.

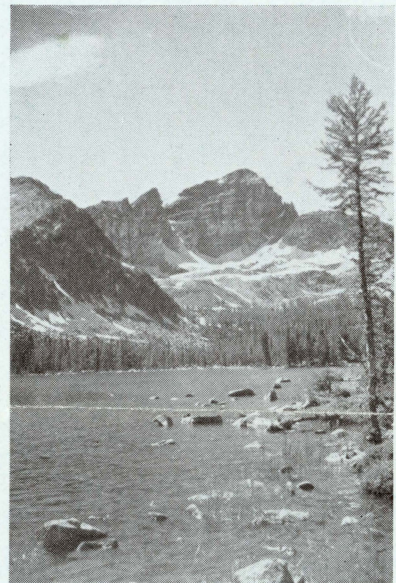
Rates are \$65 to \$75 per week, June 1 to October 1. Lower rates will be quoted groups or parties staying longer than 2 weeks. Winter rates are \$50 per week or \$200 per month. Two bath houses are conveniently located to the cabins and the ranch house and are fitted with modern plumbing, tubs and showers.

A rustic log building is especially devoted to lounging and recreation purposes. It contains rustic tables and chairs, fireplace, hardwood floor, phonograph and piano. It is popular for dancing and occasionally an orchestra supplements the other musical facilities.
