Dear Mr. Calhoun:

Yesterday I received a telegram from Mr. William M. Richardson, of the Department of Fish and Game in Los Angeles, informing me that 100,000 Rainbow eggs would arrive in São Paulo on April 14. This is good news. As I do not have Mr. Richardson's complete address, I would like to ask you to tell him that the Brazilian Fish and Game authorities are obtaining the import permit he requested. I will try to see to it that Mr. Richardson gets a telegram when the formalities here have been completed and the Brazilian Consulate in Los Angeles informed. I will be returning to Washington on or a little before April 15, so the wire may come directly from Mr. Pedro Azevedo here in São Paulo. Mr. Azevedo is the responsible Brazilian official, as I mentioned in my previous letter.
