Dear Mr. Corsi:

I read with a great deal of interest your letter of January 31 in which you indicated that there was a bill before the Wyoming Legislature to create a special grizzly bear license. This would appear to be beneficial to the future management of the grizzly bear. I would be very much interested in receiving a copy of this bill.

I appreciated learning that you thought that my talk to the Commission was informative and that it has prompted the department to proceed with a project of gathering information relative to grizzly bear management.

In order to determine numbers of grizzly bears in the National Forest areas surrounding Yellowstone National Park, it would be best to try to census them sometime during the month of August. My suggestions on doing this would be to place carcasses-horses, elk (if possible), etc., in strategically located spots in the back country. The type of site to select is near a wide open expanse of country in areas where grizzlies are known to exist. The best location for such a bait would be either just at the edge of the timber or just within the timber, preferably however in the open where the bears can be counted. Early morning and late evening would be the best time to make a count of the grizzlies coming into these kills unless a night scanner were used. In order to get an accurate count, it would be necessary to put these baits out in preselected locations all at the same time. This could be done by horseback, but would most certainly be facilitated by use of helicopter if possible. If it can be done, shooting an elk for bait would be the most economic and feasible way of securing baits.

It would be essential, ofcourse, to have an observer nearby for three or four days in order to make counts. It might not be necessary for the observer to be present for the first day or two, but he certainly should be there after this period of time. We had planned such a count ourselves with the Park Service, but then were unable to make it. If manpower is not a problem, it would be wise to have two men at each bait and probably one of them should be armed. Binoculars or spotting scopes should be sufficient to make counts and to determine approximate age and sex.

During August, most of the grizzlies in Yellowstone and surrounding areas will be concentrated in three or four areas within the Park. This means that perhaps all grizzlies censused at this time outside the Park would be resident bears.

I have rather hurriedly outlined a census plan to you, but would be glad to elaborate and go into greater detail.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:
- 11 Section 1. That Section 23-42, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled
12 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:
- 13 The Wyoming game and fish commission, in addition to the powers
14 which may have been or may hereafter be granted it, may limit the number
15 of mountain sheep, GRIZZLY BEAR, moose, MOUNTAIN GOAT, and antelope per-
16 mits to be issued in any calendar year; provided further, the game and
17 fish commission may limit the number of licenses or permits sold to per-
18 sons not residents of the State of Wyoming; provided further, no person
19 shall be eligible to make application for and receive more than one moose
20 permit, ONE GRIZZLY BEAR PERMIT, ONE MOUNTAIN GOAT PERMIT, nor more than
21 one mountain sheep permit in any three (3) year period.
- 22 Section 2. That Subsection (A) of Section 23-54, Wyoming Statutes
23 1957, Compiled 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:
- 24 (A) It shall be unlawful for any person who is not the owner of

1 a resident license or permit lawfully authorizing the same to hunt,
2 pursue or kill, or attempt to hunt, pursue or kill any elk, deer, BLACK
3 bear, GRIZZLY BEAR, moose, MOUNTAIN GOAT, or mountain sheep on any land
4 within any national forest, national park or national game refuge with-
5 in the boundaries of the State of Wyoming, any part of which is open
6 to the hunting of deer, elk, moose, MOUNTAIN GOAT, GRIZZLY BEAR, or
7 mountain sheep at any time during the calendar year in which said
8 hunting is done, unless accompanied by a licensed guide; provided,

10 need not be accompanied by more than one licensed guide for each two
11 such persons.

12 Section 3. That Section 23-67, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled
13 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

14 Any person who is qualified to receive a resident deer and
15 BLACK bear license, as defined in this act, may purchase the same
16 from the Wyoming game and fish commission or its authorized selling
17 agents. Such license will entitle the holder thereof to hunt, pursue
18 and kill deer and BLACK bear within the State of Wyoming at such time,
19 in such place, in such manner and in such amount as provided by law
20 and the rules, orders or regulations of the commission.

21 Section 4. That Section 23-69, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled
22 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

23 Any person who is qualified to receive a non-resident hunting
24 and fishing license as defined in this act, may purchase the same
25 from the Wyoming game and fish commission or its authorized selling
26 agents. Such license will entitle the holder thereof to hunt,
27 pursue, and kill BLACK bear, elk, deer and the game birds, and fish

30 Section 9. That Subsection (C) of Section 23-86, Wyoming Statutes
31 1957, Compiled 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

32 (C) Any citizen of the United States, residing or stationed in
33 the State of Wyoming, or on any reservation within the boundaries of
34 the State of Wyoming, for at least one year immediately prior to the
35 date of making application for fish or game license or permit shall
36 be entitled to a resident hunting or fishing license or permit as

1 provided herein. Any member of the armed forces of the United States
2 on active duty for a period of more than thirty days at an installation
3 or facility within the boundaries of the State of Wyoming shall be
4 entitled to a resident military hunting license or permit, and any
5 member of the armed forces of the United States, on reporting to
6 his installation or facility within the boundaries of Wyoming
7 under competent orders for active duty or active duty for training
8 to last for a period of more than thirteen (13) days, shall be
9 entitled to a resident military fishing license or permit, with

30 Section 9. That Subsection (C) of Section 23-86, Wyoming Statutes
 31 1957, Compiled 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:
 32 (C) Any citizen of the United States, residing or stationed in
 33 the State of Wyoming, or on any reservation within the boundaries of
 34 the State of Wyoming, for at least one year immediately prior to the
 35 date of making application for fish or game license or permit shall
 36 be entitled to a resident hunting or fishing license or permit as

1 provided herein. Any member of the armed forces of the United States
2 on active duty for a period of more than thirty days at an installation
3 or facility within the boundaries of the State of Wyoming shall be
4 entitled to a resident military hunting license or permit, and any
5 member of the armed forces of the United States, on reporting to
6 his installation or facility within the boundaries of Wyoming
7 under competent orders for active duty or active duty for training
8 to last for a period of more than thirteen (13) days, shall be
9 entitled to a resident military fishing license or permit, with
10 the following two restrictions:

11 1. The game and fish commission, in its discretion, shall
12 designate the area or areas within which such military hunting
13 and/or fishing licenses or permits shall be valid and the area,
14 or areas shall be stamped on each license or permit.

15 2. The game and fish commission shall issue no military
16 resident license or permit for the hunting of moose, MOUNTAIN GOAT,
17 GRIZZLY BEAR, or mountain sheep. Any person above the age of
18 fourteen years, who is not entitled to resident licenses, as
19 herein provided, but who has complied with THE other requirements
20 hereof, and of the commission for the pursuit, capture or killing
21 of the game animals, game birds and game fish of the State of
22 Wyoming, shall be entitled to non-resident licenses or permits
23 provided for herein; provided, however, the landowner's coupon
24 on these gratuitous permits be stamped "non-redeemable."

25 Section 10. That Section 23-119, Wyoming Statutes 1957,
26 Compiled 1967, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

27 In those areas wherein bear is classed as a game animal by the
28 commission, any bear doing damage to private property may be imme-
29 diately taken and killed by the owner, or employee of the owner,
30 or lessee of said property. Provided, further, that said owner,
31 employee, or lessee shall immediately notify the nearest deputy
32 game warden of such killing, and shall save and care for the skin
33 of such bear so killed, and procure a Wyoming game tag therefor.
34 In all other areas and portions of Wyoming, bear shall be deemed
35 a predatory animal.

36 The holder of a resident deer or elk hunting license, or a

1 resident BLACK bear ~~permit-(special)~~ LICENSE, or the holder of a
2 non-resident hunting and fishing license, or of a non-resident
3 BLACK bear ~~permit-(special)~~ LICENSE shall be entitled to hunt,
4 pursue and kill one BLACK bear for each license or permit under the
5 restrictions imposed by the laws of the State of Wyoming and the
6 rules, orders or regulations of the commission.

7 Section 11. Any person who is qualified to receive a resi-
8 dent grizzly bear license, as defined in this act, may purchase the
9 same from the office of the Wyoming game and fish commission.
10 Such license shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt, pursue,
11 and kill one grizzly bear, at such time, in such place, and in such
12 manner as provided by law and the rules, orders or regulations of the
13 commission.

14 Section 12. Any person who is qualified to receive a non-
15 resident grizzly bear license, as defined in this act, may pur-
16 chase the same from the office of the Wyoming game and fish com-
17 mission. Such license shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt,
18 pursue, and kill one grizzly bear, at such time, in such place,
19 and in such manner as provided by law and the rules, orders or
20 regulations of the commission.

21 Section 13. Any person who is qualified to ^{receive} ~~recieve~~ a resident
22 mountain goat license, as defined in this act may purchase the
23 same from the office of the Wyoming game and fish commission.
24 Such permit shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt, pursue, and
25 kill one mountain goat at such time, in such place and in such
26 manner as provided by law and the rules, orders or regulations of
27 the commission.

28 Section 14. Any person who is qualified to recieve a non-
29 resident mountain goat permit, as defined in this act, may pur-
30 chase the same from the Wyoming game and fish commission. Such
31 permit shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt, pursue, and kill
32 one mountain goat, at such time, in such place and in such manner
33 as provided by law and the rules, orders or regulations of the
34 commission.
