MEMORANDUM TO ACCOMPANY MR. DUNNING'S OUTLINE OF JULY 29, 1931

Time of Establishment

The plots were surveyed between August 19 and August 25 by Kevin, Hormay, and Hasel. Detailed mapping on Plots 1 and 2 was done by Hasel between August 26 and August 30, during the time Hormay mapped the mil-acre quadrats. The detailed mapping on Plots 3 and 4 was finished by Hormay and Hasel on August 31. Fencing had been completed prior to August 18.

Methods

Surveying and mapping was done as outlined in Dunning's plan. Vertical angles were read on all stakes, except the mil-acre quadrat stakes, and elevations completed. Sample plot signs were posted around the boundaries of the fenced plots.

Data

The maps, survey notes, and computations are in the Experiment Station files.

Things Remaining to be Done

Permanent stakes set at the corners of each plot, preferably 4" x 4" x 3' cedar.

All seed trees on the plots and within two chains of the plot boundaries shall be tagged and the numbers shown on the maps.

Recurrent data taken every year as outlined. The cone count and seeding of quadrats will probably not be accomplished this year (1931). Very few cones were noted. Seed placed in the quadrats in the future will likely have to be screened until seedlings are started.
