MEMORANDUM FOR REGIONAL FORESTER

On July 23 several members of our staff met Supervisor Cowen at Hill's Flat to determine the most feasible kind of water development to undertake there and to select and mark a site for the four buildings that comprise the headquarters of the Black Mountain Experimental Forest. These E.C.W. buildings are included in the construction program to be handled this summer from the Hill's Flat C.C.C. camp.

Upon returning from this meeting Dunning, Talbot and Brundage urge that adequate precautions be taken to prevent workers engaged in the construction of these buildings from cutting any trees of any size whose trunks are more than three feet outside the stretched twine that marks the outside walls of the buildings. The arrangement of the buildings is indicated on the accompanying diagram. To further guard against injury to trees near the buildings and in front of them it is suggested that all material be hauled into the building sites from the uphill side.

I am enclosing a copy of this letter for Supervisor Cowen and another for Superintendent Woolley, if you are in agreement with these suggestions.
