MEMORANDUM FOR P. D. Hock, U. S. Forest Service, Susanville

You probably heard from Phil Lord or Norman Dale that the cattle are in the experimental pastures at Squaw Valley. Everything seemed to be in good shape when I left Monday, June 5. I understood that your crew was going to fix the windmill in Squaw Valley this week. I did not have a chance to check whether the fence around the little meadow in the southwest corner of the timber pasture was up. It should be, since as you know, we do not want the cattle in the timber type to get any meadow feed. Will you please have the boys check the small section of fence around this meadow while they are out on the area.

Thanks for the plot at Dry Lake. I hope to be back a day or two before the 16th when the cattle are due for a second weighing. I am sorry I did not get to see you this trip, but I hope I have better luck next time.
