

Reference is made to Phil Lord's memorandum of February 15 relative to cattle for the Burgess Spring Experimental Range this summer.

As Normay mentioned to Veldon Parker at the Investigative meeting in Berkeley in January, we do not plan to gather any additional cattle weight data this summer and therefore will not have need for experimental cattle. Our main objective this year is to summarize the results of our past work (15 years) and put the information out in publication form. We are working feverishly to get out a manuscript by mid field season if possible, so that we will have time to go over it with you and other field personnel to check certain points in the field.

If you care to use the experimental pastures this summer to take care of some heifers for Mrs. Jafcoat, you are more than welcome. The pastures will carry about 30 head, as follows: East meadow pasture, 8 head; west meadow pasture (which is now joined with the east portion of the timber pasture through the corral), 14 head; and the west portion of the timber pasture, 8 head. If the stock are distributed this way, there will be no interference with the future experimental use of the pastures next year or thereafter.
