The beginning of the grazing season has rolled around again and we wonder whether you have decided to place some permittee stock in the Burgess Springs experimental pastures this summer or not. If the pastures are to be grazed Hornay will want to protect some spots in both the timber and meadow areas from grazing and to safeguard other experimental values. So if you have decided to graze the area this year would you let us know how many head you plan to put in each pasture and the approximate date when you plan to put them in.

As Hornay's analysis and write-up of the results of the past 12 years is pushed along this summer and fall we shall, from time to time, want to get together with you on future planning of experimental work on the Harvey Mountain allotment. Whether or not we will resume experimental use of the Burgess Springs pastures by next season will depend upon the result of these huddles with you and your staff, the Regional Office and others who may be concerned.

We hope the recent rains have been beneficial and that your season develops favorably.
