
The night of the 15th will be spent in Jordan Valley, Oregon, returning to Boise on the evening of the 16th.

Range Research is now considering assignment of Dr. Richard Driscoll, leader of the Range Inventory and Evaluation Project, to the job sometime this winter. We believe he should assume senior authorship and complete preparation of the kind of brochure desired. Co-authorship will be given Mr. Hormay. Dr. Driscoll would put together a manuscript using such other assistance as he requires here and from the Western Stations and Regions. The brochure will be issued from the Washington Office.

We understand this is now in rough draft in so far as rest-rotation grazing is concerned, and it will be of real value in completion of the brochure.


You will note from the attached copy of a memorandum to Director Stoddard that we propose to have approximately 27 of our employees attend. The State Director for California has indicated there will be 22 in attendance from his State. This will probably be a much larger class than Mr. Hormay usually encounters; however, those from the California and Nevada State Offices will be attending primarily as observers.

In your letter of August 18, 1964 to all State Directors, you indicated that Mr. Hormay would like to see 2 or 3 of the study allotments in each State prior to the classroom sessions. According to the schedule furnished by our Washington Office the period November 9-13 was designated for Mr. Hormay's pre-conference visits to California and Nevada. It is believed that the study allotments in Nevada can be examined within a 2-day period and we can arrange to meet him in Elko, Ely or Reno whichever location he would prefer. The Ely area probably has a greater variety of vegetation types, as well as seasons of use. We have discussed the pre-conference field tour dates with California personnel and they too are agreeable to letting Mr. Hormay select the dates that will best fit his schedule. We will therefore await his advice.

Reservations have been made for Mr. Hormay at the Holiday Hotel, Mill and Center Streets, beginning the night of November 15. The Holiday is somewhat closer to the Nevada State Office than other

downtown hotels and is where most of the conferees will be quartered. If Mr. Hormay prefers a different hotel or wishes to make his own reservation, we would appreciate his advising us.
