SUBJECT: Forest Disease Research (Big sagebrush)

Your reference:

The fungus infecting big sagebrush (Artemesia tridentata) brought in by you is the rust fungus Puccinia absinthii (Hedw. f.) DC.

This rust is quite common and ranges from Wisconsin to British Columbia, southward to Texas and southern California; also in Mexico, Central America, Europe, and Japan. The fungus is autoecious, meaning that it does not require an alternate host to complete its life cycle, but reinfects the same host. It attacks 33 known species of Artemesia.

Although common and widespread, we have never experienced extensive damage to the plants except occasional light defoliation.

Dear Mr. Franks and Mr. Hormay:

We have been evaluating our 5 pasture project from all of the various aspects, range conservation, future condition, and especially financial.

We can see that selling 88% calf crop, averaging 400# and getting 34¢ per pound, and running 1200 cows - with the high cost of operation here and the sometimes long winter season - will not be a very profitable operation. A few bad breaks (or poor management) would put the red ink on all of the books in a hurry.

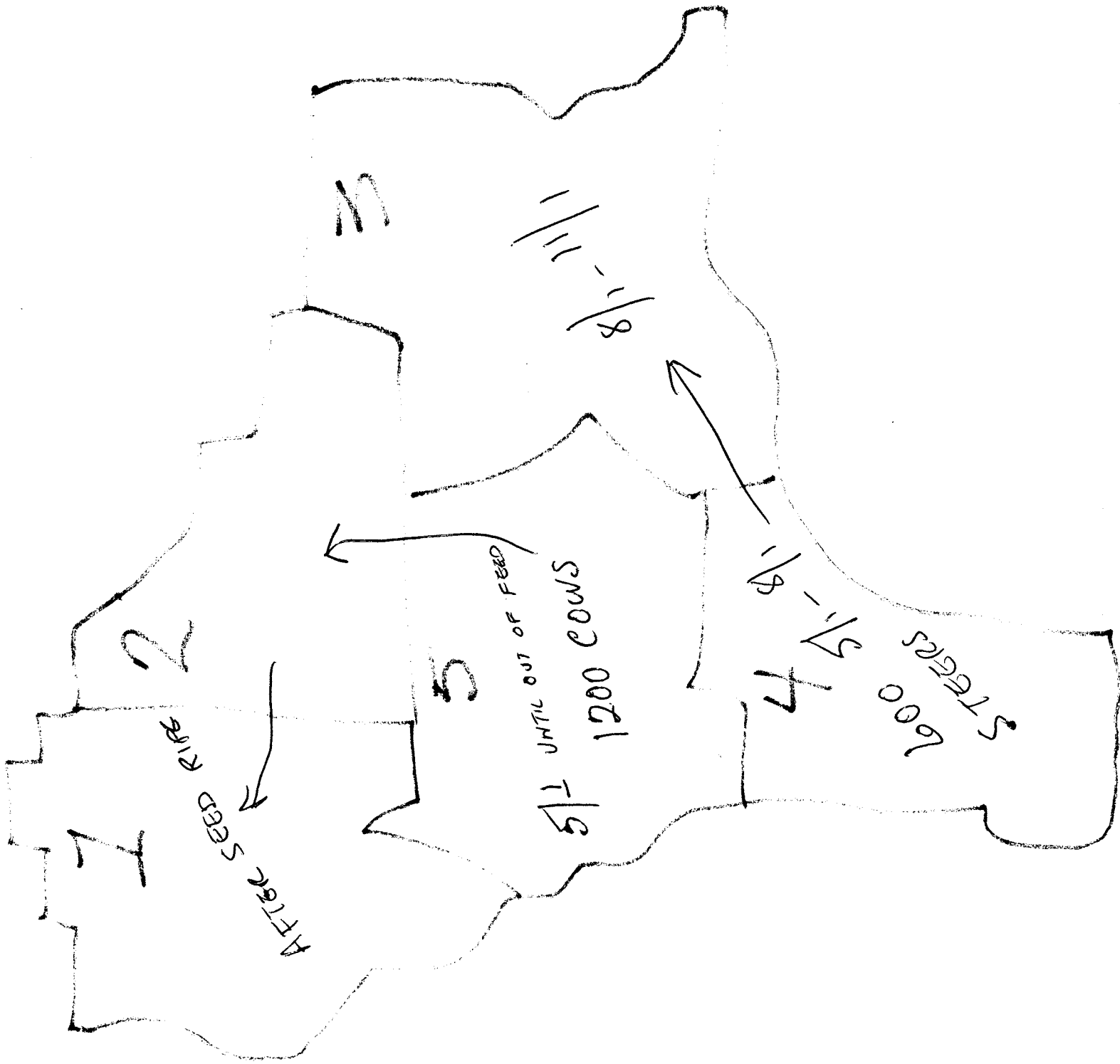
So we have been getting some advice from all sides as to which way to turn for a better more economical operation. The best all-around advice we can get, and this meets with all of our own thinking as well, is to run however many cows that 3 pastures can support on a rotation basis, and run as many yearling steers as the other 2 pastures will support. If the steer operation turns out as well as it has for many other combination outfits in the state, then we might want to cut the cows to 2 pastures and increase the steers to 3.

We have discounted, entirely, the apparent carrying capacity this year. We have used the results we got last year, which was a very dry season. And we have used the range results from a regrowth and reseeding standpoint that we have obtained on the entire 5 pastures up to date.

We think we can run 600 cows and 600 steers at Granger from 12/1 to 5/1 for the bunch and some of the calvy cows up to 5/15, plus about 4,000 sheep from 12/1 to 5/1. Then we would run the 600 steers on 2 pastures, Nos 4 (5/1-8/1) and 3 (8/1-11/1). Nos 4 & 5 have not been used to date, and outside of very light later use until snow-in time will not get any use. Then we would run our 125 yrl hfrs and the balance of our cow herd, about 1050 cows in Nos 1, 2 and 5, starting in 5 then to 1 and 2 last. We think the counter-clockwise circle in these 3 pastures might work out better, because the present method is not working at all. Our future numbers would depend up the amount of carry-over feed and general range conditions, and we would eliminate the steer phase when necessary to reseed if we found we were not getting the full benefit of our program.

We hope we can make a range inspection in October to discuss this.

Subject: Monthly Report, September 1967

Practically the entire month was taken up preparing for and conducting range management training courses in Pocatello, Idaho, September 11-15 and Burns, Oregon, September 18-22. On the 25th and 26th I helped the Carson City District establish trend plots for use during the coming two range training sessions in Reno in October.
