Explanation Question 20. Declaration of prospective trial juror (A. L. Hormay)

I would like to be excused from jury duty to have time to complete life long work for The federal government.

I was retired on May 31, 1977 at age 70 (mandatory) after working for The U.S. Forest Service at The Pacific Southwest Forest and Range Experiment Station, Berkeley, California for 36 years in The field of range management research and for The Bureau of Land Management for 11 years as a range management advisor. The nature of my work is described briefly in the attached citation.

I had not completed several long time studies for The Forest Service nor projects for The Bureau of Land Management and other government agencies at The time of my retirement. I have made arrangements with The Forest Experiment Station and other agencies to carry on with my work and have been at it since retirement.

It will take 4 or 5 years of concentrated effort to conclude and publish the results of some of my more important studies. Time could run out on me at any time

No other man has currently contributed as much to promoting proper use and management of the total natural rangeland environment, both public and private, and alleviated so many inherent conflicts. Mr. Hormay has motivated technicians, stockmen and conservationists alike to utilize expertise in designing management practices. As a tribute to his distinct role in the management and conservation of the Nation's natural resources, Mr. Hormay is granted the highest honor of the Department of the Interior, the Distinguished Service Award.
