

Prescribed use is based on the concept of total forage produced in a given pasture. Since the dates scheduled above for pasture moves are only estimates, please watch your range and notify us when you feel it is time to move the cattle. Even if prescribed use hasn't been quite reached over the entire pasture, large areas of use greater than 70-75% around streams should not occur. If you have trouble maintaining a good distribution pattern in a particular pasture, you may need to move early.

The actual on date is dependent upon range readiness. We will notify you about a week before the regular season of the actual authorized date to go on the range. The authorized on and off dates are the first and last days that cattle are to be on the National Forest or State Game Range, including any trailing to and from the allotment or pasture. We will probably contact you about your planned arrival on the range so that your cattle can be counted.

This year I feel we've all made a big step forward in our cooperative management of the range resource on National Forest and on the State Game Range. Your use the next couple of years will be extremely important to the continuation of the program. We will check range readiness on the Wall Creek Pasture and try to have you move the cattle into it as soon as it is ready, regardless of actual use on the State Game Range. If the upper range is ready and the cattle are moved up before 7/16, you may be able to use the Game Range Pasture for a few days again in the fall.

As mentioned at the Association meeting, we will inspect your improvements again this year. We will be looking for a total maintenance job that will protect and prolong the life of the improvements, not just enough maintenance to keep the improvements serviceable.

We'd still like to get together with all or most of the Association members to ride the allotment this summer. The ride will provide a good opportunity for the newer members to become better acquainted with the allotment, and for everyone to look for opportunities to improve our management. We'd specifically like to look at the need for reconstructing some fences and to plan the Wall Creek Lake pipeline.


As you know, all motorized vehicle use must be in accordance with the Beaverhead National Forest Travel Plan. Any off-road travel outside the areas or routes designated in this plan must be approved in advance in writing.

We still need to document investments you make for the maintenance of improvements on your allotment. This information is used on a regional basis in computing the grazing fees. Please keep track of your time, miles, gas, and expenses. We will request this information this fall.

Since the Forest Service will not be able to do much trail maintenance again this year, please maintain those trails you use for livestock movement.

We're looking forward to working with you again this summer. If you have any questions or problems, please let us know.


