

Dear Gus,


I expected to hear from you by now, but realize that other things probably got in the way. Are you planning to give a presentation at Baker this fall/winter? Would you plan to look Paul Ringling's place over at the same time? Do you think there is a possibility I would be involved in either of those two operations? Neil (Martin of Miles City) has indicated to me that he assumed I would in fact be involved.

I visited the Schwartz Ranch east of Cascade, Mont with Mike Frisina this past Sept. You remember that was the ranch you and I went to a couple of years ago where a Savory system was implemented. After four years it was obvious to both Mike and I that that particular grazing system simply doesn't have enough rest in it. We pointed out to Mr Schwartz that he will have to rest the "paddocks" more than the current system does. Schwartz agreed to follow a suggestion that Mike and I recommended, namely, that in one of the paddocks he follow the three treatments you recommend. I will write up some kind of plan for that paddock for him. I will send you and Mike a copy.

I also suggested to Rancher Ed Grady who has a place northwest of Helena that he needs to revise his grazing system so that it incorporates the three treatments. I told him I would come to his place sometime this winter and we'd discuss some possibilities. I have been on several SCS and Conservation District sponsored field trips on Grady's ranch, so I am at least kind of familiar with what he is doing. Grady is a state legislator, and last July Frisina and I took him on a tour of Mt Haggin. He was impressed, and concluded that perhaps he has not incorporated enough rest in the grazing operation he employs on his ranch. That's the reason I said I'd be happy to sit down with him and discuss his situation. So here is another one you'll be hearing about.

Mike Frisina, his wife Ruth and I have been discussing the possibility of putting together a Video that shows people that wildlife and livestock habitats and management systems are compatible under R/R. There are a number of Grants and Assorted Funding Sources from non-profit foundations who specialize in funding such Educational Projects. What do you think of such an idea and project? If such a project was embarked upon, it is assumed you would provide the necessary guidance and advice. Nicht war? Hope all is well with you.
