Dear Gus:

This will confirm our understanding in relation to the Station assisting completion of the six studies outlined in your May 29<sup>th</sup> letter to the Director, Ron Stewart. We have been assured that the data you plan to collect is relevant to current National Forest management and, with the past data, represents long-term trends impossible to otherwise recover.

The Station will assist with data processing and manuscript preparation as personnel are available and workloads permit. Our statistical section can determine appropriate data input formats and analyses. Our information section can provide editorial review of manuscripts and arrange for Station or Journal publication as appropriate.

A major job will be data and manuscript input into the Data General computing and processing system. I was not clear whether the Region or the Station would be responsible for assisting with those tasks. If the Station, then I suggest that you contact Ray Ratliff in Fresno [(209) 487-5196]. He is ready to work with you, as his other duties permit, to facilitate completion and publication of your studies.

We very much appreciate your plans to provide the Forest Service copies of the data upon completion of reports. Whether through the Station or the Region, we trust that detailed data collection procedures, maps, and photographs will also be made available for archiving and retrieving. Such long-term data bases should be periodically updated to maintain the ecological information they contain.

Please contact me if I can help facilitate assistance by Station personnel.
