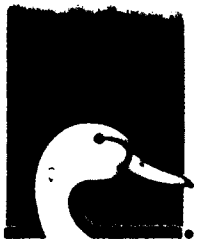

Dear John:

I would like to strongly support the nomination of Jack D. Jones for the Distinguished Service Award from the Montana Chapter of the Wildlife Society.

Jack is a dedicated professional whose efforts to develop, maintain and improve wildlife habitat deserve special recognition. While a MDFWP Game Management Biologist in north-central Montana, I had the good fortune to work with Jack at the field level nearly 25 years ago. Jack always operated with the best interests of the resource as his primary motive.

Jack's efforts to develop waterfowl habitat during the 1960's, and throughout his tenure as a biologist, certainly place him at the highest level of professionals working directly with the basic resource - habitat. He has developed and promoted sound livestock grazing management, and especially Rest Rotation Grazing as developed by Gus Hormay. This work is particularly noteworthy within a Federal agency where this management system has not always attracted much support. Jack, while a biologist in north-central Montana, was one of the first to recognize the benefits of this system to soil, vegetation and wildlife, and he has continued to promote RR grazing management throughout his career.
