I've read most of them and just recently finished A Bartender's Story, which I enjoyed very much. His books take up more space on my bookshelves than any other author's and last year I gave a program on him at a women's group to which I belong.

My husband and I were fortunate enough to be in Miles City a few years ago when Ivan held a book reading on, I think, "Bucking the Sun". You were with him, too, I believe...

My family came to Montana in 1945 and the bulk of my childhood was spent on our dry land farm near Rapelje. My best and most lasting memories were made there and that is probably why I have such an affinity for him and his books. I was born in 1940 so was raised in the same era, which perhaps gives me a special understanding of the times of which he spoke.

The first three he wrote got me hooked (and I don't own one of them as at that time I was fortunate enough to have a friend who shared hers with me). However, the 40s and 50s were a special time in our country's history — and Montana's, too.

I look forward to reading "Sweet Thunder" and the one coming out in August. I'll just be sad that that will be the end of the list.

We recently passed through White Sulfur Springs and noted the Red Ants Pants store front. Have heard a lot about the business but have never met Sarah Calhoun. I and my husband just may have to take in the festival this summer.





He made no mention of it in his Christmas letter, of course

At times Ivan has been seen by me as a sort of competitor, but that was only in our early years and since then he has served as a sort of inspiration. He took his path and I took mine, but I think the way I studied his writings—often rereading a paragraph a bunch of times—he helped pull me in better directions from my strictly-objective journalistic prose (which I have never been able to shake).

He was kind to me, and to my family members. Do you recall when you two met my parents in Seattle? And once when I was up in Madison staying with my brother, I noted in the CapTimes that Ivan was in town for a reading. I surprised him at the reading, then we three went out for coffee. I treasure that memory.

As I treasure a memory of a hike we took up in the mountains in probably 1970—I think you were there—and one of Ivan's friends guided us up to the snow area. That is sweet to me.

And to camping out at the ocean that summer of 1981 when I taught summer school at UW. You told us to go to a certain spot, save tent space, and then you arrived later. I have the photo of our family that you took--framed between the rocks—on our wall and how often I look at it and remember!
