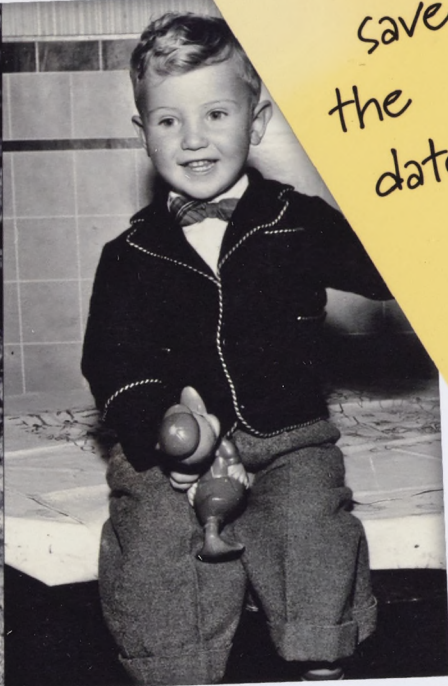

Years later some locals raised it at her grave, and eventually friends put a tire around the carved hat, enlarging it in accordance with her original wishes.
