To supplement the above by recipes and explanations, we have a world of material giving minute directions which are used by Wyoming people who can produce meals from the above materials and with the above mentioned utensils that are very delicious.

Brook Trout may be ordered at most any restaurant in the State during a great part of the year. Wild meats, such as antelope and elk, when in season.
