



BLODGETT CANYON IN THE
BITTERROOT VALLEY

One of the wild, lonely canyons that slash the Bitterroot mountains, near Hamilton along U.S. 93 is Blodgett, pictured here. Only an artists eye can really do justice to the striking display of gray, brown, ochre and reds which the massive crags present. Route of the Lewis and Clark Expedition in 1805-06, this area is now Montana's greatest fruit growing section. Blodgett is similar in scenic beauty to portions of the Gallatin Canyon (p. 44) along U.S. 191 South of Bozeman.
