Old Business orders for new or additional copies of the current recovery plan were taken; b. Bennett will remind FWS about the M.O.U.; a meeting among recovery team members and FWS personnel will soon convene to address our proposed genetic assessment of various greenback stocks; d. there was no other old business. 3. Progress reports a. **CDOW** 1) NE Region reviewed status and progress with Zinn Ponds, Wigwam Creek and Craig Creek; a meeting to clarify the status of Craig Creek will likely take place the week of February 11. FS advocates the re-introduction of beaver into Wigwam Creek drainage to re-establish dams, thus enhance trout habitat. The attainment of 1 (maybe 2) more quality habitats will put the NE very close to DOW recovery goals of 15 populations. New personnel introduced themselves: Rolf Nittmann, Doug Krieger. 2) Central Region biologist Phil Goebel met the recovery crew and began to familiarize himself with this new aspect of his job. SE Regional report was given by Don Wurm, who recapped 3) 1983-84 progress and 1985 plans on Greenhorn Creek, Cottonwood Creek, Lake Fork Creek and Boemoer (#2) Reservoir. NPS/FWS progress was summarized by Dave Stevens. He dis-4) cussed the RMNP catch-and-release fishing program; successes at Bear Lake, West Creek, Ouzel Lake and Creek, Fern Lake Lawn Lake. Plans for 1985 include North Fork of Big Thompson, (Lost and Huston lakes and North Fork Falls). 5) FWS/FTC report from Pat Dwyer. Production of greenback fry for 1985 is estimated at 75,000 fish. There is an apparent surplus, as only 40-45,000 fry are currently requested. The team and consultant will re-scope these needs and contact Bruce Rosenlund with amendments to their stocking requests prior to February 15. Rosenlund is also the contact for logistic planning in our attempt to procure eggs/milt from South Fork Cache la Poudre stock. Dwyer requested two (2) batches of milt from Como Creek (Hidden Valley?) greenbacks in 1985. Greenback stocking rates have been 1000 fry/acre in lakes and about 500/stream milc versus 200-300/acre in lakes by CDOW.

- USFS representative Al Collotzi met his new team mates; reports were given for
 - a) Pike-San Isabel: Brenda Melton illustrated our cooperative ES-CDOW project in the SE and NE regions, and reemphasized planned work on Zinn Ranch Ponds, Bruno Gulch and Craig Creek. Substantial discussion ensued, resulting in the decision that a letter outlining the Recovery Team position on this issue would be drafted
 - b) Bob Stuber (Roosevelt-Arapaho Forests) summarized FS work on South Fork (Poudre) milt take, Pennock Creek, West Creek, fingerling and fry stocking and habitat enhancement projects. 1985 plans call for ambitious field work on Pennock, West, Bard and Como creeks: population monitoring, habitat enhancement and an evaluation of fry vs. fingerling stocking survival.
- Dr. Kurt Fausch (CSU) reported on the progress of graduate student Tim Cummings on a CSU-FS cooperative project. Tim should be able to enhance our understanding of population abundance, age-and-growth and competitive interactions (with brook trout). Tim mentioned that he perceived considerable confusion on the part of fishermen when confronted by RMNP fishing regulations.
- 8) Don Prichard discussed how his BLM work helped with SE regional work, and that as result of his request for resources, BLM has allocated up to 1/2 man-month of labor plus supporting equipment for use on greenback work ("statewide"). Positive suggestions on how this resource could be used can be sent to Bennett (CDOW) by the middle of February, and will be assembled and forwarded to Don in Canon City.
- 9) 1984 stocking rates and sites can be found in the appended table (-from USFWS Annual Report).

The tentative date for fry delivery from Bozeman is (Tuesday) September 24; and the contact is Bruce Rosenlund.

An update on the "rumor" that Rosenlund, then the Recovery Team was nominated for Researcher of the year by the Wildlife Federation ... no rumor. Bruce picked up an impressive eagle print symbolizing our Team award at the banquet - January 26. I suggest that the award circulate between participating management agencies for about 6(?) months at a stretch; any other suggestions?

The Greenback Cutthroat Team would like to take this opportunity to formally acknowledge the high level of expertise and enthusiasm with which Bob Stuber served as a Recovery Team member. Though not formally a team member, we all hope we will continue to benefit from his council and hard work. Thanks, Bob.

BROODSTOCK PROGRAM

USFWS Fish Technology Center

During 1984, the USFWS Fish Technology Center shipped 35,988 greenback cutthroat to Colorado for the purpose of establishing new self sustaining populations of greenback cutthroat trout within the South Platte River drainage as part of the Greenback Cutthroat Trout Recovery Plan. The following is a summary of areas stocked with greenback during 1984.

Greenbacks at 15.7/lb were shipped 11 July 1984, and the greenbacks at 1618 to 1691/lb were shipped on 11 September 1984. Greenbacks at 15.7/lb (140 mm) were stocked during 1984 as an experiment to determine if the stocking of larger greenbacks would be more efficient in higher velocity stream habitats.
