NOTE There are also many books on fishing in the <u>SK</u> section of the Library of Congress classification system. However, the <u>SK</u> books are technically books covering both hunting and fishing. Some of these books are almost entirely on fishing, some hardly mention the word (if even that- the category is vague enough that many books only on hunting or only on fishing are in there). It is impossible to separate out just the <u>SK</u> books related to fishing for a list like this without pulling down each and every book, but I would guess there are about 50 to 100 books in that section that are at least marginally related to fishing.

The following lists are from the sections of the Library of Congress classification system that are entirely dedicated to fishing.

My brief exposure to the Toppan collection of fishing and hunting books left me amazed that such a collection is housed in our region (I only wish Mr. Toppan had been a resident of Colorado and left his library to C.S.U.). I want to call attention to this collection and have it assessed and publicized. I will send copies of this letter to Venice Beske (Hawk Springs, WY) and Paul Schullery (Yellowstone Park). Venice is a librarian by trade and historian for the American Fisheries Society. Paul is former executive director of the American Museum of Fly Fishing, authored a book on the history of American fly fishing, and is an adjunct professor of American studies at the University of Wyoming.

I am not a qualified antiquarian, but when I saw the ancient book of verse signed by Izaak Walton, Halford's limited edition containing the flies of his period, Dean Sage's personal scrapbook, and many other ancient treasures I was only able to quickly scan before the center closed for the evening, it was apparent that Mr. Toppan was a serious collector of angling literature.

By way of this letter, I will ask Venice and Paul if they could arrange a visit and assess the Toppan collection. Their assessments should let interested people know of this collection- - The American Fly Fisher, publications of Trout Unlimited, the Federation of Fly Fishers, The American Fisheries Society (newsletters of history section, Western Division, and Fisheries), and any other appropriate outlets.

Do you have a list of the Toppan acquisition? If so, I would very much like a copy so that the next time I'm at the University of Wyoming I could better budget my time with the Toppan collection.

I. Introduction and Statement of Purpose

"Some of the best fishing is done not in water but in print." Sparse Grey Hackle

Sparse Grey Hackle was the pen name of Alfred W. Miller (1893-1983) who was a reporter for the *Wall Street Journal*. As Sparse Grey Hackle, he contributed to the "fishing ... in print" by writing articles on fishing for publications such as *New York Times* and *Sports Illustrated*. He was in good company. The literature of fish, fishing, and angling is extensive. Westwood and Satchell's *Bibliotheca Piscatoria*, published as long ago as 1883, catalogues over three thousand works. Perhaps the greatest contributor to fishing and angling literature has been Izaak Walton and his *The Compleat Angler*, the first edition of which was published in 1653.

One of the best places to go "fishing ... in print" is the Toppan Library at the American Heritage Center in Laramie, Wyoming. Almost 500 volumes about fish and fishing are included within the collection of Frederick W. Toppan (1902-1966), sportsman and collector of sporting books.¹ This collection is supplemented by other books and provides an excellent resource to research and enjoy the history and literature of fish, fisheries, fishing and angling. It contains a copy of Westwood and Satchell's *Bibliotheca Piscatoria* mentioned above and an excellent sampling of the various editions of Walton's *Compleat Angler*. They will be the focus of this paper.

Angling is the art of catching fish with a rod, a line, and a hook. It is an ancient and honorable sport; its roots lie deep in the past, a tradition intangible but persistent governs its conduct. The tradition, which received its form and best expression from Izaak Walton and Charles Cotton, permits the angler to be guileful and deceptive, and to bring to bear on the contest whatever wisdom and experience he has been able to accumulate-for so will the fish.

But it urges that the fight

be fairly fought, and that the fisherman show a lively curiosity about-and a decent respect for-the natural equilibrium of life in lake and stream. Fishing, of course, may be done by other methods and with other motivations. But it seems to be true that applying the art in terms of the tradition yields the maximum of satisfaction and is most soothing to the spirit.²

Koller, in this introduction to his book, *The Treasury of Angling*, written in 1964 provides an outline of this paper. First, by using and defining both "angling" and "fishing," second, by referring to angling's "roots," and finally, by recognizing Walton's and Cotton's role in the development of these "roots."

II. Definition of Fishing and Angling

It is important in surveying the documentation and literature of fishing and angling that the terms "fishing" and "angling" be understood. Fishing is the broader term and refers to everything from fly fishing and sport fishing to net fishing and commercial fishing. Angling specifically refers to "fishing with a hook," "angle" being from the Old English *anga* meaning hook [Akin to Old High German *ango* meaning hook, and Latin *uncus*, Greek *onkos* meaning barbed hook]. Angling in current usage refers to fishing with a hook, line and rod.

In the United States at the present time, there is very little distinction made between fishing and angling. Fishing is the most popular term and the different types of fishing are distinguished by adding a descriptive word. eg. fly fishing, commercial fishing, bait fishing, or sports fishing. Sports fishing has generally been used when referring to fishing for recreation or sport versus commercial fishing which is applied to fishing for food. In recent years, however, the term "angler" has become popular as it can be used for fisherman, fisherwoman, or fisherperson.

Outside of the United States and historically, there is and has been more distinction between the two words. According to the entry under angling in the 1903 *New International Encyclopedia*, "the term angling has, by common understanding, become restricted to the catching of fish as a source of recreation, while the word fishing expresses it as a commercial enterprise."³


III. History of Fishing and Angling Documentation and Literature

The early documentation and literature of fishing and angling reflect the use of both terms. The earliest known picture of an angler is from an Egyptian wall painting done in 2000 B.C. [Plate 1].⁴ Angling was a favorite form of recreation among the Egyptian men. The Romans also pursued angling for diversion. Shakespeare's *Antony and Cleopatra* (1607) reflects the Egyptian and Roman interest in fishing. Fishing was also important to the Greeks of 500 B.C. as illustrated in Hartwig's "Die griechischen Meisterschalen. [Plate 2].⁵

Claudius Aelian in *De Animalium Natura* (About 200 A.D.), wrote about the Macedonians fishing with an artificial fly:

They fasten red wool around a hook and fix to the wool two feathers that grow under a cock's wattles, and which in color are like wax. The rod they use is six feet long and the line of the same length. Then the angler lets fall his lure. The fish, attracted by its color and excited, draws close and ... forthwith opens its mouth, but is caught by the hook, and bitter indeed is the feast it enjoys, inasmuch as it is captured.⁶

The first Anglo-Saxon text in which fishing is mentioned is the *Colloquy on the* Occupations, a late tenth-century book by Aelfric the Abbot, a great writer and

teacher of the time. He describes the use of nets, fish hooks, and bait by professional fishermen, the kind of fish caught, how they were sold, etc. but doesn't speak of fishing as sport or recreation.⁷ Aelfric's purpose in writing the book was to teach his students Latin, the Latin translation being written beneath each Anglo-Saxon line.

Modern angling history and literature begins in the fifteenth century with the publication of the essay "A Treatyse of fysshynge wyth an angle" in the second edition of Dame Juliana Berners, *The Boke of St. Albans*. This book was printed in 1496 in England by Wynkyn de Worde [A facsimile copy of the *Treatyse* portion is in the Toppan Library]. It was written about seventy-five years earlier and one incomplete manuscript copy, made by a scribe around 1450 survives and is in the Yale University Library.⁸ The book includes lengthy descriptions of the rod as well as instructions for making and using artificial lures or "flies." The *Treatyse* is also the first documented use of the word "angle" and is listed as such in the *New English Dictionary on Historical Principles*, the 1901 edition of the *Oxford English Dictionary*.⁹

There is considerable controversy and research regarding Dame Juliana's actual role in the writing of this work and whole volumes such as John McDonald's *The Origins of Angling* (1963) have been written about it. However, it continues to be attributed to her and as recently as 1992, a thesis was written on "how a fifteenth-century author approached the problem of writing accurate, technical prose on angling, a subject never before treated in a written work."¹⁰

The *Treatyse* was the basis of angling knowledge and literature for the next one hundred and fifty years. During that time, only a handful of books on fishing were

published. Some of these included *The Arte of Angling*, Anonymous in 1577; *A Booke* of Fishing with Hook and Line, by Leonard Mascall in 1590; Hawking, Hunting, Fouling and Fishing, by William Gryndall in 1596; Certain Experiments Concerning Fish and Fruite, by John Taverner in 1600 [Facsimile in Toppan Library]; Secrets of Angling, the first Angling poem by John Dennys in 1613; and A Discourse of the General Art of Fishing with an Angle, by Gervase Markham in 1614.

In 1653, at the age of 60, Izaak Walton published the first edition of *The Compleat Angler*. During the next three centuries, this book would prove to be the most popular angling book ever, averaging more than one new edition every year.

IV. Izaak Walton and The Compleat Angler

Izaak Walton (1593-1683) was best known during his life for his biographies of John Donne, Sir Henry Wotton, Richard Hocker, George Herbert, and Robert Sanderson. It was the time of John Milton and Samuel Pepys. It was also the time during which many "Compleat" Books were published in England [Appendix 1]. One of those was Walton's *Compleat Angler, or contemplative man's recreation*. Since its publication, at least 480 editions have been published [Appendix II] and whole bibliographies have been devoted to it [Appendix III].

During Walton's lifetime (age 60-83), five editions of *The Compleat Angler* were published, the last being in 1676. The first edition, published in 1653, was very basic but many facsimiles have been published of it [Toppan library has a very fine one known as the "First Black Facsimile", published in 1928]. A second edition was published in 1655, two third editions published in 1661 and 1664, and a fourth edition in 1664. All of these editions had small changes. The Fifth edition, was different. First, its name was changed to *The Universal Angler*. It included Walton's *Compleat Angler* as Part I; but also contained, as Part II, Charles Cotton's *Compleat Angler*, *Being Instructions how to Angle for a Trout or Grayling in a Clear Stream*, published for the first time; and, as Part III, Colonel Robert Venables' *The Experienced Angler*, of which this was the fourth edition. Since then, editions of *The Compleat Angler* have mostly included Cotton's part but never again Venables' work. Also, the title returned to *The Compleat Angler* rather than *The Universal Angler*.¹¹

V. The Compleat Angler since Walton

The subtitle of Westwood and Satchell's *Chronicle of the "Compleat Angler" of Izaak Walton and Charles Cotton* is "... a bibliographical record of its various editions and mutations." The word mutation is very applicable to most of the editions of the *Angler* since Walton's time. They all are identified by the name of the editor, publisher, language, or, in at least one case, illustrator of the edition [Appendix II]. About 2 out of every 3 are based on Part I (Walton's) and Part II (Cotton's) of the 5th edition of 1676. Almost all of them contain some of the illustrations of fish that were part of the first edition. Many of them have substantial additions in the form of introductory essays from the editors, fine illustrations, bibliographies, calendars, species charts, and endnotes. Some are very fine and others reflect poor craftsmanship. All of these characteristics and qualities are reflected in the seventeen editions in the Toppan Library collection. A description of each of these follows.

Edition:

The "first Moses Browne edition" was published in 1750, 74 years after Walton's fifth edition. Moses Browne, author of *Piscatory Eclogues*, is said to have been inspired by Dr. Samuel Johnson. Browne is credited by Oliver and Horne as rescuing the *Angler* from apparent oblivion.¹², ¹³

The title-page identifies this as "The seventh Edition, Very much amended and improved, and the title-page to Part II reads, "The Third Edition, improved with Notes, etc." In reality, it is a reprint of parts I and II of the 5th edition of 1676.

Binding:

Brown calf; gilt stamped ("Contemporary" binding)

Illustrations:

The title page refers to the "draughts of all the Fish; ornamented with a number of copper plates". These illustrations, which were from the First Moses Browne edition were "widely copied" in subsequent editions. I feel they are fairly crude.

Provenance:

Bookplate of Lewis Mansfield Knapp (1894-) Author and Scholar. Part 1, Chapter 1 has signature of Henry [Madjon?].

The "first Hawkins Edition" was published in 1760, shortly after the "second Moses Browne edition" and in fact, there was competition between the two editors at that time. Like Moses Browne, Sir John Hawkins may also have been inspired by Dr. Samuel Johnson, since "he was a member of the famous Literary Club organized by the great critic and conversationalist."¹⁴ According to Horne, there were 14 Hawkins editions or reprints issued between 1760 and 1826, some of them given two numbers depending upon whether they were "editions" or "reprints." This 1792 issue is a reissue of a 1791 edition except for a new title-page to Part I. The title-pages of both the issues are imprinted "The Fifth Edition, with Additions," an indication that they are both reprints from the original fifth edition of 1676. To avoid confusion, this 1792 issue is sometimes referred to as the sixth reprint.

Contains a description of 284 editions of *The Compleat Angler* published through 1935 arranged in chronological order. According to Oliver in the introduction, all earlier lists and bibliographies of Walton and angling literature were consulted to compile this bibliography. Each edition is given a unique number. Gingrich,²⁷ states that Oliver has "been considered indispensable to all serious collectors of Izaak Walton, since dealers' offerings of the various Walton editions are usually identified by their "Oliver numbers"...."

Westwood, Thomas and Thomas Satchell. The Chronicle of the "Compleat Angler" of Izaak Walton and Charles Cotton: being a bibliographical record of its various editions and mutations. London: W. Satchell, 1883.

One of the bibliographies devoted to *The Compleat Angler*, written by the compilers of *Bibliotheca Piscatoria*, one of the most thorough works on fish and fisheries. The first edition of this work was published in 1864 and recorded 53 editions of Walton's work. This edition records and reviews 97 editions. Includes list of editions [xxi]-xxii.

VII. CONCLUSION

One of the consistencies in most of the editions of The Compleat Angler from

Walton's first in 1653, through the most recent, is the inclusion of the words and music of *The Angler's Song*. The words are as follows:

Man's life is but vain; For 'tis subject to pain, And sorrow, and short as a bubble;

'Tis a hodge-podge of business and money and care; And care and money and trouble,

But we'll take no care When the weather proves fair; Nor will we vex now tho' it rain;

We'll banish all sorrow, And sing till tomorrow, And angle and angle again.

The words of this song are timeless, reflecting the hectic pace and shortness of life.

Perhaps that is why The Compleat Angler continues to be popular 350 years after its

first printing.
