

Slide description for six months in scotland: Left to right, row after row, starting at top:
Plastic File #1. Row one:

1. Sea lock near Ullapool, NW scotland. Farmed salmon pen.
2. Our home for six months. (You could have had a bedroom all to yourself)
3. The Beauly
4. Sea lock near Ullapool, NW scotland. Farmed salmon pen.

Row two:

1. Town of Lock Inver, NW scotland
2. The Kirkaig river near Lock Inver
3. Author fishing atlantic salmon on the Inver
4. Another view of our home for six months

Row 3:

1. Unknown river going to sea in NW scotland
2. The Beauly. There is a rowboat on every beat to help the angler cross over if he wants.

Row 4:
